

# Sanitation and Recycling

*Waived for residents of the Hawthorne area  
Ward 3 / Annexed May 2021*

**One-time cart deposit fee of \$50.00 and \$25.00 service fee**

**Sanitation and Recycling monthly fee is \$21.50.**

The assigned collection day is currently **Monday** for Sanitation and Recycling

- Roll-out carts and recycling bins should be at the curb by 7:00 am on collection day and removed before the following day.
- All trash must be bagged and in the City provided/approved cart

## **Items that are prohibited:**

- Tires
- Car parts
- Construction material
- Paint and/or hazardous waste such as fuel, poison, acid etc.

## **Recycling materials accepted at curbside:**

- 1-2 plastics
- Cardboard boxes
- Mixed paper
- Paper-based food boxes & cartons
- Aluminum cans & steel cans must be clean and free of contents/empty

## **Recycling materials that are NOT accepted at curbside:**

- Glass (may be taken to the Recycling Center as sorted by color)
- Batteries
- Paint Cans
- Styrofoam
- Grocery or take-out bags
- Wood
- Food Waste

**Yard Waste** – Normal size amount of yard waste are picked up on Wednesday of each week, except during weeks where the sanitation schedule adjusts to a holiday schedule. During holiday weeks, Wednesdays are utilized for rescheduling and there would be no yard waste collection during that week. This includes large item collection.

- Very large piles may be picked up by the end of the day on Friday.
- Grass clippings, leaves, pines straw and twigs must be in brown paper bags.
- Limbs need to be less than 4 feet in length and no thicker than 8” in diameter (absolutely no rocks, dirt, mulch and/or decayed material of any kind will be collected).

**Large Item Collection** – The assigned day for large item collection is Thursday, except during holiday weeks. All large items are subject to a \$25 pickup charge. Note: No large item(s) will be collected during holiday weeks. Residents may check the holiday schedule posted on the utility bill, on the City of Smyrna website, on social media and as listed on the yellow decal placed on top of the City issued sanitation cart.
