ADMINISTRATION



This week, the Smyrna Arts Council hosted their **Hispanic Heritage Artist Talk** in the Council Chambers. The Hispanic Heritage exhibit is displayed in City Hall through the end of the year.

PUBLIC WORKS

Water/Sewer Division: The Water/Sewer Division has completed the evaluation of all underground infrastructure for the LMIG resurfacing program which included video inspection and cleaning to check the condition and integrity of the pipes before our upcoming yearly paving schedule. This will ensure that we will not have any issues under a newly paved road that will cause us to have to dig up a newly paved road. Inspection and cleaning of project is 100% complete. All repairs have been scheduled and are underway on underground infrastructure. All repairs consist of Goodwood Blvd, Campbell Rd, Hawthorne Ave, Marston, Vineyard Way, North Cooper Lake Dr, and Hickory Lane. The project is 70% complete.



SPLOST - Windy Hill Boulevard: Baldwin has started the installation of storm drain on the southern side of Windy Hill. Baldwin has started building back the southern side drive lanes now installing GAB which is the second layer of roadway construction.



Water Distribution: The sewer crew is in Ward 6 cleaning and video inspecting sewer main lines for the overall integrity of pipe. Once this has been inspected, management staff will evaluate video to have repairs made to our sewer infrastructure. The project is 70% complete.


Street Department: The Street Department is continuing the Oakdale Road median project. The project is 75% complete.

South Cobb Drive Water Line Project Phase II:

The project's scope of work involves installing new 8-inch and 12-inch water main lines on the east and west sides of South Cobb Drive from Benson Poole Road to Concord Road. The contractor has completed lying the new water main. The intersection of Concord @ South Cobb bore has been completed. PWC has started putting together a punch for this project and is 97% complete.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

America Recycles Day: Keep Smyrna Beautiful will be celebrating America Recycles Day on November 19. America Recycles Day is a nationally recognized day dedicated to promoting and celebrating recycling by Keep America Beautiful. We'll hold two tours at the Smyrna Recycling Center at 9am and 4pm. Other activities will include games, recycling education resources, and more.



Smyrna Wondrous Winter Cleanup: KSB is hosting the Smyrna Wondrous Winter Cleanup on December 18th. The cleanup supplies are provided through a grant from the Keep Georgia Beautiful Foundation awarded to Keep Smyrna Beautiful earlier this fall. Sign-up is now available.

Community Cleanup: KSB volunteers picked up 66 pounds of litter on Pat Mell Rd, including 13 pounds of recycling, during a Community Cleanup event on November 3.



Large Item Amnesty Day: On November 6, KSB and Public Works partnered for the annual Large Item/Bulky Trash Amnesty Day. 246 cars came through to drop off large items, such as mattresses, broken furniture, and old carpet. In an event survey that about 6% of participating residents responded to, Bulky Trash was given 5 out of 5 stars across the board. Some comments included:

Adopt-a-Mile: KSB's Adopt-a-Mile program has wrapped for 2021! Over 300 volunteers cleaned up over 3,900 lbs. of trash from 64 miles of roadway in Smyrna.

Recycling Center:


