Water Distribution: The Sewer Crew is in Ward 6 cleaning and video inspecting sewer main lines. The Project is 70% complete.

PUBLIC WORKS

LMIG: The Water, Sewer, and Street departments have completed the evaluation of all underground infrastructure for the LMIG resurfacing program. This included video inspection and cleaning to check the condition and integrity of the pipes before our upcoming yearly paving schedule. This will ensure that we will not have any issues under newly paved roads, and will save us from redigging newly paved roads. The inspection and cleaning of the project are **100%** Complete. All repairs have been scheduled and are underway on underground infrastructure. All repairs consist of Goodwood Blvd, Campbell Rd, Hawthorne Ave, Marston, Vineyard Way, North Cooper Lake Dr., and Hickory Lane. The project is **70%** complete.



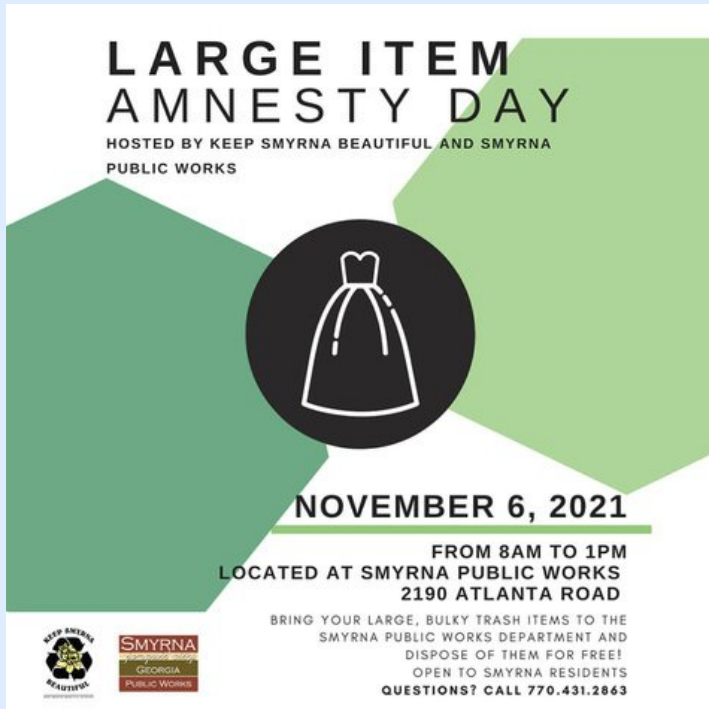
Street Department: The Street Department has started the Oakdale Road median project. We have currently installed 5 islands for this project. Project **70%** complete.

Public Works South Cobb Drive Water Line Project Phase II: The project's scope of work involves installing new 8-inch and 12-inch water main lines on the east and west sides of South Cobb Drive from Benson Poole Road to Concord Road. The contractor has completed laying the new water main. The major intersection on Concord at South Cobb along with Powder Springs at South Cobb remains to be completed due to the complexity of the existing water main needing to be tied on to new ductile iron. The project is **95%** complete.



SPLOST - Windy Hill Boulevard: Baldwin is prepping to start the installation of the storm drain, and a temporary sidewalk on the southern side of Windy Hill. Baldwin has started building back the southern side drive lanes and are now installing GAB, which is the second layer of roadway construction. Baldwin is also continuing to work on pothole utilities.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

Recycling Center:

- Number of weekly recycling patrons (October 27th-30th): 456
- Material recycled in October: 90,388 lbs.
- Material recycled in 2021: 943,879 lbs. We've surpassed the amount of material collected in 2020 and should recycle over 1 million pounds by the end of November.
- Community Service Program: Community service volunteers picked up litter from 9 streets and collected 286 lbs. of litter on October 30th. In October, the community service program collected an estimated 1,133 lbs. of litter from city streets. Since this program resumed in June of 2021, an estimated 5,049 lbs. of litter has been collected.
- Recycling Center Tours: The center is offering monthly tours to the public. Residents can sign up to tour the Smyrna Recycling Center every third Friday of the month. Upcoming dates: November 19th and December 17th.
- The recycling center is open on Tuesdays as of November 2nd. Current schedule:
 - Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, 8:00am-4:00pm
 - Thursday, 10:00am-6:00pm

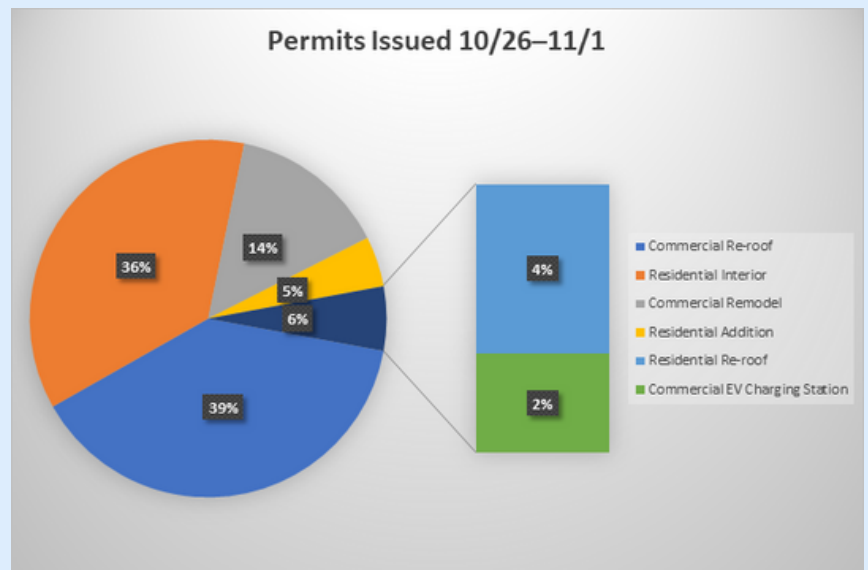

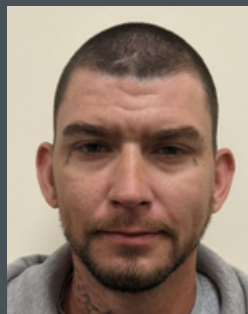
