ADMINISTRATION



PUBLIC WORKS

Water/Sewer Division: The Water/Sewer Division has completed the evaluation of all underground infrastructure for the LMIG resurfacing program which included video inspection and cleaning to check the condition and integrity of the pipes before our upcoming yearly paving schedule. This will ensure that we will not have any issues under a newly paved road that will cause us to have to dig up a newly paved road. Inspection and cleaning of project is 100% complete. All repairs have been scheduled and are underway on underground infrastructure. All repairs consist of Goodwood Blvd, Campbell Rd, Hawthorne Ave, Marston, Vineyard Way, North Cooper Lake Dr, and Hickory Lane. The project is 100% complete. See below for before and after images of failed pipe and repaired piping.

Water Distribution: The sewer crew is in Ward 6 cleaning and video inspecting sewer main lines for the overall integrity of pipe. Once this has been inspected, management staff will evaluate video to have repairs made to our sewer infrastructure. The project is 75% complete.

AWIA: Management and staff, along with various other departments such as Fire, Police, Community Relations, and IT department have completed the second section of the AWIA (American Water Infrastructure Act) Audit. This audit was comprised of two sections, first being the risk and resilience and the second part pertaining to the Water Emergency Response Plan (WERP). This plan was certified on the 4th of December 2021 with local and federal EPA along with State EPD. This is one of the many audits Public Works must do to keep our water permit number WSID#607007.

PUBLIC WORKS



Sewer Model: Public Works has been working on a sewer model for the city for over 4 years now. PW is happy to report that the sewer model has been completed to ensure that all development that comes into the city has the capacity. From this model, PW can determine if the sewer system can handle the extra flow impacting system from proposed developments. This allows us to catch all upgrades that will need to be done before large-scale development is approved.

Resurfacing: Annual resurfacing contract has begun. The roads being resurfaced this year are Campbell Road, Hawthorne Avenue, Camp Highland Road, and North Cooper Lake Road. We are paving Hawthorne Ave starting this week.



SPLOST - Windy Hill

Boulevard: Baldwin started installation of storm drain on the southern side of Windy Hill, building back the southern side drive lanes and installing GAB which is the second layer of roadway construction. They also started installing sheet pile to start the southern side phase of the box culvert.



South Cobb Drive Water Line Project Phase II: The project's scope of work involved installing new 8-inch and 12-inch water main lines on the east and west sides of South Cobb Drive from Benson Poole Road to Concord Road. The contractor has completed lying the new water main. The intersection of Concord @ South Cobb bore has been completed. The entire project has been completed.

GA Gives Day: Last week, Keep Smyrna Beautiful participated in GA Gives Day, raising \$1,645 to support a clean, green, and beautiful Smyrna. As part of GA Gives Day, KSB shared information about their work: so far in 2021, they have picked up 15,627 pounds of litter, recycled 4,100 Christmas trees, and diverted 35,080 pounds of paper from landfills through document shredding.

Community Cleanups: A Community Cleanup scheduled on 12/6 was canceled due to weather, but there are still a few volunteer slots available for the Smyrna Wondrous Winter Cleanup on December 18.

Garden Tour: KSB has set April 30, 2022, for their annual garden tour. This year, however, will be an Art and Garden Tour and will be produced in collaboration with the Smyrna Arts Council to celebrate Smyrna's 150th birthday. Bring One for the Chipper: Christmas Tree Recycling is KSB's annual Christmas tree recycling event! Live trees will be chipped and used as mulch giving them a new purpose rather than being sent to the landfill. This event will be held on Saturday, January 8th from 9am-4pm at The Home Depot in Vinings, 2450 Cumberland Pkwy.
