# **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Sewer Model:** The City received a sewer model showing areas with insufficient sewer capacity in Ward 3. The sewer department is inspecting the areas and clearing any blockages.

**Sewer Outfall:** Yearly Sewer outfall cutting has begun throughout the city. Outfalls are the main trunk lines that carry the majority of the city's sewer into cobb county for treatment. These lines run through wooded areas that follow the stream beds and must be cut and maintained so the sewer lines can be inspected to prevent overflows into tributary waters. Currently taking place in Ward 2.

**Valve Maintenance:** Conducting preventative valve maintenance in Ward 5. This preventative maintenance will extend the lifecycle of the City's infrastructure.

**San Fernando Water Line Project:** Work has started on the project including a preconstruction meeting, locating existing utilities, and contractor mobilization.



**Street Department:** Retaining wall failed along Windy Hill Blvd. Street Department is clearing debris and coordinating with a contractor to replace the wall as soon as practical.

**Speed Table Installed:** A speed table was installed on Church Road between South Cobb Drive and Old Concord Road as part of the traffic calming list.

#### **SPLOST-Windy Hill Boulevard:**

Repair rock base damage from erosion during heavy rains. Install stormwater catch basins at Ventura. Coordinate with Atlanta Gas Light to suspend 6-inch gas main at culvert near post office.

Resurfacing: Public Works is continuing its annual resurfacing contract (75% complete). The roads being resurfaced this year are Campbell Road, Hawthorne Avenue, Camp Highland Road, and North Cooper Lake Road to be milled and paved this week.

**Building & Grounds:** Rehabilitating the hardwood floors in Brawner Hall. Sanding to remove existing finish, install stain for color, and seal with a polyurethane.

Bring One for the Chipper: On Saturday, January 8, Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers hosted Bring One for the Chipper at The Home Depot on Cumberland Pkwy. Despite a chilly start, it was a beautiful day, and 375 residents dropped off trees on the day of the event. Thousands more trees were dropped off in advance. The trees will be chipped into mulch and distributed to the community rather than ending up in a landfill, both extending the tree's usefulness and preserving limited landfill space. At the event, KSB distributed information about recycling in Smyrna as well as 174 dogwood seedlings and 1,324 packets of vegetable seeds. Additional dogwood seedlings are available for adoption at the Smyrna Recycling Center.



**MLK Day Cleanup:** Coming up this week, a Community Cleanup is being held the morning of MLK Day.

Recycling Center: The Smyrna Recycling Center had 590 patrons during the week of January 4th-8th. The next tour will be on January 21st.

#### **2021 Circulation of Library**

Materials: Library materials circulation continued to return to normal as 2021 progressed.

December 2021 circulation was 11% higher than December 2020, and nearly 3% higher than December 2019 (pre-pandemic). Overall circulation for the year improved 15% over 2020, but was still 17% below 2019

#### Friends' Book Discussion Group:

When the pandemic hit nearly two years ago, the long-running Friends book club immediately pivoted to virtual and never missed a discussion. The group meets the first Tuesday evening of the month with their most recent discussion of The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek by Kim Michele Richardson on January 4, 2022, generating a lively group of nine readers. **Car Break Ins:** Over the past couple of weeks, we have seen an increase in car break ins and stolen vehicles in the area of S. Cobb Drive from Highlands Parkway to the 285-overpass bridge. As we analyze our crime trends and adjust our patrolling techniques, we have noticed several areas of concerns that we are seeking your help with.

- Many of the stolen cars were left unattended and running with the keys in the ignition.
- High value items like laptops, pocketbooks, gym bags, cash, cell phones, tablets, and even firearms are left in plain sight, unattended, and unsecured.

The City of Smyrna is a safe place to live, work, and play; however, crime and crimes of opportunity do happen from time to time. If we work together, we can all help reduce and detect criminal activity from happening.

#### **Crime and Safety Tips:**

- Never leave your valuables in your vehicle in plain sight and unsecured (especially FIREARMS)
- Park your car in well-lit areas
- Never leave your car keys in the ignition with the car running and the vehicle unattended
- Keep your driveway light on at night and/or have a motion sensor light installed
- When you see suspicious behavior or activity REPORT IT to 911 IMMEDIATELY
- Always be aware of your surroundings & be self-aware
