## **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Sewer Model:** The City received a sewer model showing areas with insufficient sewer capacity in Ward 3. The sewer department is inspecting the areas and clearing any blockages.

**Sewer Project:** Sewer project for CCTV and cleaning has begun in Ward 4. Federal EC will be preforming the work for City of Smyrna. This project will help insure the life span of the current sewer system.

**Valve Maintenance:** Conducting preventative valve maintenance in Ward 5. This preventative maintenance will extend the lifecycle of the City's Infrastructure. As well, we are installing new valves on bank street to help reduce outages in the future. The City of Smyrna is starting to enter into the lead and copper testing required by the state.

**San Fernando Water Line Project:** Work will start on the project on the 31st. We have held a preconstruction meeting, located existing utilities, and mobilized contractors.



**Street Department:** The department is doing a small curb and gutter replacement job on Dogwood Circle to help with drainage.

**Resurfacing:** Public Works is continuing its annual resurfacing contract (87% complete). The roads being resurfaced this year are Campbell Road, Hawthorne Avenue, Camp Highland Road, and North Cooper Lake Road. North Cooper Lake Road is 95% complete with new asphalt.

#### **SPLOST-Windy Hill**

**Boulevard:** Installing last lift of GAB to get ready for paving on the southern side of Windy Hill. Anticipated to pave the southern side of Windy Hill mid to late February and get ready to transition traffic back to the southern side of Windy Hill. Still working to coordinate with Atlanta Gas Light to suspend 6-inch gas main at culvert near post office.

#### **Great news for Family History Buffs!**

Smyrna Public Library is now a FamilySearch Affiliate Library, which means it has access to more genealogy resources to help you make family discoveries. The designation means local library patrons now have greater and more convenient access to a wealth of genealogical resources. FamilySearch is a popular web service that has over 6 billion searchable names and 2 billion images of historical genealogical records.

FamilySearch adds over 300 million free genealogical records and images online yearly from all over the world and manages the famous Family History Library in Salt Lake City. It has amassed billions of birth, marriage, death, census, land and court records from more than 130 countries to help you discover and make family connections.

Anyone may access the public version of FamilySearch on the web at familysearch.org. To view even more records, visit Smyrna Public Library and ask to use the Genealogy Workstation. You may also access Ancestry.com, MyHeritage, and HeritageQuest databases at this workstation.




#### Smyrna Teens are for the birds: In

This month's post comes from *The Marietta Journal* for January 22, 1885. Local correspondents in each town would report weekly anecdotes and news to the regional paper in Marietta.

-Dr. Tom McKown, of Jonesboro, visited our town last Saturday and returned home Monday. -Smyrna has a new store. The firm name is Turner & Co. Our fellow townsman, T.P. Whitfield, is the gentleman behind the counter.

-Mr. Wesley Hendricks, of our vicinity, is growing fruit trees for market, and has some very choice apple and pear trees.

-Mr. Judson Eubanks, who has for several years been in mercantile business in Atlanta, has turned farmer. We extend to him the right hand of fellowship.

**Wolfe Center:** The Wolfe Center will host AARP Tax Aide beginning February 2. They will be at the senior center every Wednesday through April 13, 2022.

Activities: For the week of January 17 thru January 23 Parks & Recreation managed 26 rentals in various locations for events. The rentals generated a revenue of approximately \$10,000

**Maintenance:** Parks Maintenance crews are working on fields and surrounding areas getting them ready for Spring League play that begins February 1.

**Restroom and Water Fountain Closures:** As a reminder, some restrooms and water fountains throughout the parks system remain closed for the winter months to prevent rupturing of pipes and fixtures.

**The Community Center fitness area** is open for individuals that would like to work out, but avoid the cold. The fitness area is open Monday – Saturday, 8:00 am – 10:00 pm and Sunday, 10:00 am – 7:00 pm. Members have access to equipment including treadmills, ellipticals, a cardio bike and assisted weigh-lifting machines. For the walkers, the indoor track is a warm place to work in a mile in only sixteen short laps around. Currently, the fitness area is free to City employees.

**Spring League Play for Adults:** Registration is open now and will close Friday, February 25 for the Spring sports leagues. Join the fun this Spring while playing softball, soccer or basketball with your peers or new group of friends you'll make along the way. Great opportunity to gather a team from your office or church and enjoy some friendly competition with others. This year "free agents" will be able to register. Participants who register individually will first be combined to form a new team (if enough individual participants exist). If there are not enough participants to form a new team, players will then be paired with existing teams who are looking to add more players to their roster, in the order they registered. In the event we are unable to pair individual participants with an existing team, or if there are not enough teams to fill the league, all individuals will be refunded in full.
