




Library Teens Raise Funds for Literacy Group:

PUBLIC WORKS

Water Sewer Distribution: Kick off to the lead and copper inventory has started this month with finalization of maps and staff strategizing on the next steps to testing and verification. Last meeting to finalize current inventory and mapping will be held February 21st, Intro to Mayor and Council March 3rd at Committee of the Whole.

Sewer project for CCTV and cleaning has begun in ward 4, Federal EC will be preforming the work for City of Smyrna. This project will help insure the life span of the current sewer system. The project is currently 20% completed. Water/sewer made an emergency sewer main repair on Doeskin trail this week due to footage found on CCTV.

Water Distribution: Water main replacement on Estell Ct consists of replacing 500ft of galvanized piping has started and will take roughly three weeks to complete. This work is part of Public Work's plan to replace all galvanized lines and asbestos cement.

The Water Department is currently Changing out meter dials to ensure accurate reading.

Public Works San Fernando Water Line Project:

Contractor Boring driveways this week along with long side service bores. Contractors are currently working on Inglewood drive moving towards San Fernando.

Street Department: The Highlands Parkway island and turning lane has been completed as part of the Oakdale Road traffic calming improvements, with the exception of minor landscaping to be done.

Sanitation: Running the Pilot Program with a simple app called "Run Go" allows managers to input routes into the app and send to new drivers to open on an iPad. This takes the drivers through the routes turn by turn. This not only saves time and money, but allows our division managers to continue day to day operations without having to instill months of training to teach drivers new routes. Management is still working with the IT department to see how we can integrate this in with Smyrna's new work order system.

SPLOST-Windy Hill Boulevard: Installing last lift of GAB to get ready for paving on the southern side of Windy Hill. Coordinating with Atlanta Gas Light to suspend 6-inch gas main at culvert near post office. Contractor installing curbing and sidewalk near the intersection of South Cobb Dr.

Resurfacing: Punch list has been sent and waiting on Contractor to complete before releasing retainage. Staff is now preparing list of roadways for FY 2023.




