Keep Smyrna Beautiful: Last Friday, Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up 68 pounds of litter on Village Parkway, including 20 pounds of recycling. In total this February, 50 volunteers donated 76 hours of time to pick up 365 pounds of litter, place 41 storm drain markers, monitor the health of four streams, and plan for future events.

Middle School Volunteer: Campbell Middle School volunteer Jackson Taylor finished up an independent service project last week, during which he picked up 90 pounds of litter at various locations in Smyrna.

Recycling Center: The Recycling Center recycled 93,568 lbs. of material and had 2255 patrons in February. So far in 2022, the center has recycled over 185,000 lbs. of material and had 4,400 patrons.





PUBLIC WORKS

Water Sewer Distribution: Kick off to the lead and copper inventory has started this month with finalization of maps and staff strategizing on the next steps to testing and verification. Meet with 120 Water to finalize current inventory and mapping, intro to Mayor and Council will be on March 3rd at Committee of the Whole.

Sewer project for CCTV and cleaning has begun in ward 4, Federal EC will be preforming the work for City of Smyrna. This project will help ensure the life span of the current sewer system. The project is currently 20% completed. Ardito construction made water and sewer taps on Concord Road and Old Concord Road for future homes being built.

Water Distribution: Water main replacement on Estell Ct consists of replacing 500ft of galvanized piping has started and will take roughly three weeks to complete. This work is part of Public Work's plan to replace all galvanized lines and asbestos cement.

The Water Department is currently changing out meter dials to ensure accurate reading.

Water locators are in the process of locating all of Campbell Road for At&t fiber line installation.

Public Works San Fernando Water Line Project:

Contractor Boring driveways this week along with long side service bores. Contractors are currently working on Inglewood drive moving towards San Fernando.

Street Department: Street Department is starting a beautification project in the Afton Downs neighborhood. The Afton Downs neighborhood generates approximately \$2M/acre in property tax value, which is significantly higher than most neighborhoods across the city. The Street Department is starting work on Afton Downs curb and gutter and expect to pave the streets this summer.

Street Department is currently in process of grading and repaving from Doeskin Trail due to storm drain and sewer repair.

SPLOST-Windy Hill Boulevard: Paving the eastbound lanes will begin this week and should be completed within 2 weeks. South side at South Cobb and Windy Hill, contractors will be installing curbing and sidewalk.

Storm water Pipe Lining: Contractor continues to line storm water pipes that have exceeded their useful life. The work is approximately 30% complete.

Public Works Resurfacing: Completed and staff is now preparing list of roadways for FY 2023.

Building and grounds: This week building & grounds is installing a high efficiency boiler at city hall. Also, repairing and painting the archway at the fountain.


