


Smyrna Art & Garden Tour: Tickets for the Smyrna Art & Garden Tour on April 30th are now available for purchase online:

PUBLIC WORKS

Lead and Copper Inventory Project: Kick off to the lead and copper inventory has started this month with the finalization of maps and staff strategizing on the next steps to testing and verification. The Smyrna City Council approved water testing for lead and copper. Letters regarding testing will be going out to customers on April 4th in Ward's 3 and 6. Following the letters, test kits will be sent out with instructions on how to collect and return the samples.

Close Caption TV Sewer Project: The sewer project for CCTV and cleaning has begun in Ward 4. Federal EC will be preforming the work for City of Smyrna. This project will help ensure the life span of the current sewer system. The project is currently 30% complete.

Water and Sewer Taps: Ardito Construction made water and sewer taps on Stephens Street for future homes being built. The Water Department installed new water and sewer taps for Brinkley Park's new concession stand.

Estell Court: Water main replacement on Estell Court, consisting of replacing 500ft of galvanized piping, has started and will take roughly three weeks to complete. This work is part of Public Works' plan to replace all galvanized lines and asbestos cement.

Dial Change Out: The Water Department is currently in process of changing out meter dials to ensure accurate reading. So far 400 out of 1200 dials have been replaced and or calibrated.

Pothole Corrections: The Street Department has addressed potholes on Spring Road, Atlanta Road, Windy Hill Road, Manson Avenue, and Pinehill Drive.

Grass Mowing: The Street Department has started its annual right of way grass mowing in addition to arm mowing a line of site issues and heavy vegetation.

SPLOST-Windy Hill Boulevard: Paving of the eastbound lanes should be completed this week. The contractor expects to shift traffic onto the newly paved lanes by mid-April.

Stormwater Pipe Lining: The contractor continues to line stormwater pipes that have exceeded their useful life. This work is approximately 35% complete.

Resurfacing: Resurfacing projects on North Cooper Lake Road and Hawthorne Avenue have completed and staff is now preparing a list of roadways for 2023.

San Fernando Water Line Project: Contractors are boring driveways this week using long side service bores. Contractors are currently working on Inglewood Drive moving towards San Fernando.

Line Installation: Water locators are in the process of locating all of Campbell Road for AT&T fiber line installation.



Beautification Project: The Street Department is starting work on curbs and gutters in Afton Downs. Staff expects to pave the streets this summer.

Improvements and Repairs: The Historic Taylor-Brawner House is getting a new paint job along with other needed improvements. Crews have begun scraping and priming the house as well as replacing bad wood prior to painting. If the weather cooperates, the job is expected to be complete this week.

Tolleson Pool was drained and is receiving needed repairs to fix a water leak and reinforce the gutter system. Work will be complete and the pool will be ready to open for Summer 2022 on Memorial Day weekend.

Programs News: Programs are seeing near pre-pandemic participation at the Community Center. Classes for gymnastics and dance may be joined monthly during the year through May. Tae Kwon Do offers classes throughout the year and participants may join at the beginning of any month.

New Program at Smyrna Community Center: STEAM Generation will be holding Spring classes (April 14 – May 20). These classes are for ages PreK – 8th grade and will be held on Thursday and Friday afternoons. The Spring session will focus on Mechanical Engineering.

Tree Rescue: On Thursday, March 10th Engine Two was dispatched to a person stuck in a tree after an arborist accident. An arborist was trapped approximately 30' - 40' in a tree after a large branch pulled his flip line causing him abdominal and hip injuries. Several large branches were cut to make access to the arborist. Firefighters then strapped into the tree and released all the equipment holding the arborist and then lowered him to the platform. He was then lowered from the platform to the hose bed of Engine Two with a stokes basket and then to the ground using a roof ladder.

Purchasing Department Updates:

Park Renovations: Ashford Gardeners was awarded to renovate the surrounding area at the playground in Brawner Park and some updates to Durham Park.

Library Restrooms: TSW Design was awarded for architectural services to remodel all of the Library restrooms.

Wolfe Center Restrooms: Lichty Commercial Construction was awarded to build out the new restrooms at the Wolfe Center.



Grant Project: Rebuilding Together-Atlanta was awarded to oversee a grant project for low income Smyrna homeowners to help with needed home repairs.
