Document Shredding: On Saturday, April 9th, Keep Smyrna Beautiful held its spring Document Shredding event. A total of 449 cars came through to securely shred and recycle 20,460 pounds of documents, keeping them out of the landfill.

Storm Drain Marking: On Monday, April 18th, three volunteers marked 40 storm drains between South Cobb Drive, East-West Connector, and King Springs Road. Storm drain markers remind folks that whatever is put down storm drains goes directly to local streams, affecting the health of our waterways and local wildlife.





Adopt-a-Mile: Despite the bad weather, a couple of Adopt-a-Mile groups did go out to clean their mile on our scheduled Adopt-a-Mile day, Saturday April 16th. They collected almost 100 pounds of trash. The remainder of the groups will reschedule in the coming weeks.

Education/Outreach: On Monday, April 18th, 16 preschoolers and 2 teachers from Smyrna First United Methodist visited the Smyrna Recycling Center. They took a tour and practiced recycling with a hands-on papermarking activity!

Community Cleanups: On April 6th, Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up 154 pounds of litter, including 32 pounds of recycling as part of a Community Cleanup on Windy Hill and Village Parkway. Volunteers from the Adventist Marietta Central Hispanic Church did an independent cleanup on April 10th, picking up 8 bags totaling 120 pounds of litter from Benson Poole Road. On April 12th, volunteers came out for another Community Cleanup, picking up 84 pounds of litter, including 30 pounds of recyclable material from Spring Hill Parkway.

Recycling Center: The Recycling Center has recycled 42,080 pounds of materials so far in April and has had 1,185 patrons. The center will be closed on Saturday, April 30th.







PUBLIC WORKS

Sanitary Survey: The Sanitary Survey (Environmental Protection Division) audit was completed on March 30th. The Consumer Confidence Report/Water Quality Report was submitted and certified on April 5th.

Lead and Copper Inventory Project: Letters regarding testing were sent out on April 4th. Private daycare test kits began going out on April 5th. Private resident test kits were mailed out on April 18th.

Close Caption TV Sewer Project: The sewer project for CCTV and cleaning has begun in Ward 4. Federal EC will be preforming the work for City of Smyrna. This project will help ensure the life span of the current sewer system. The project is currently 70% complete.

Automatic Flusher Project: Five automatic flushers throughout the city have been turned on to ensure proper water quality.

Sewer Tap Installation: Water and Sewer crews installed a sewer tap on Gordon Circle.



Completed Safety Training: A group of Public Works employees recently completed their Flagging Safety Class. Great job!

Meter Dial Change Out: The Water Department is currently in the process of changing out meter dials to ensure accurate reading. So far, 600 out of 1200 dials have been replaced and or calibrated. In addition to that, 400 meter boxes and lids have been changed out.



Locksmith Class Completion: Mario Kimble completed his locksmith class. Congratulations Mario!

Curb and Gutter Work: The Street Department is starting work on curbs and gutters in Afton Downs. Staff expects to pave the streets this fall.

Grass Mowing: The Street Department has started its annual right of way grass mowing in addition to arm mowing a line of site issues and heavy vegetation.

Sinkhole Repair: The Street Department repaired sinkholes on Nancy Circle

Tree Removal: The Street Department removed a fallen tree at the Public Works retention pond.

Sidewalk Replacement: The Street Department has began to replace the sidewalk on Old Cabin Trace.

Building and Grounds: Building and Grounds is remodeling the entire inside of the new southside police building on Wilson Drive.

SPLOST-Windy Hill Boulevard: The contractor (Baldwin Paving Company) installed a barrier wall and traffic has now been shifted on Windy Hill Boulevard. Baldwin Paving Company is now pouring small sections of the header curb.

Downtown Improvements Project: The tree removal downtown has been completed. The traffic signal at Powder Springs Street and Atlanta Road is now operational. Road closures and demolition work for this project have begun.

ENGINEERING

Temporary Signal Activation – Atlanta Road at Powder Springs Street: The temporary signal was activated at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Powder Springs Street on April 7th. This traffic signal is in coordination with the Smyrna Downtown Redevelopment project.





Overhead Flashing Beacon – Riverview Road at Nichols Drive: Mast arms were set on April 12th for an overhead flashing beacon at the intersection of Riverview Road and Nichols Drive. The overhead flasher was installed on Thursday, April 14th and is now active. This overhead flasher is intended to increase awareness of the all-way stop condition at the intersection.
