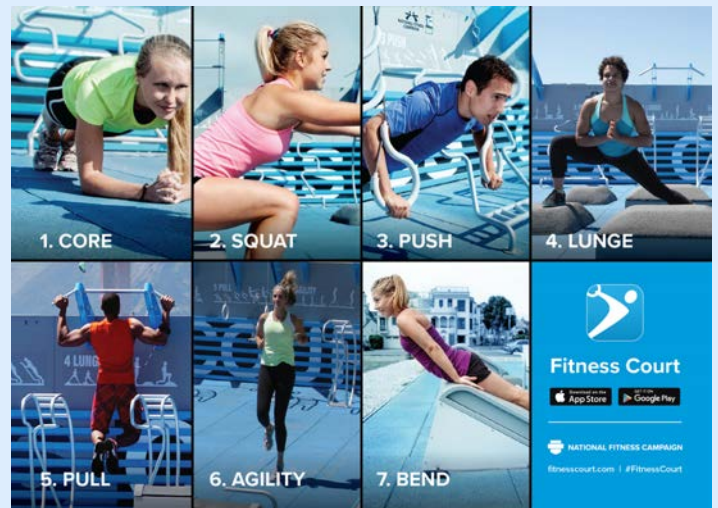
The Smyrna Handmade Market: The Smyrna Handmade Market continues to have great crowds on Sundays in the Market Village. There are currently 60+ vendors scheduled each week with products ranging from fresh produce, local honey, coffees, baked goods, frozen prepared meals, soaps, and more! The market is from 11AM – 3 PM each Sunday through October 23.

Community Center Painting: The Community Center received a refresh this week with the Magnolia Room, the Dogwood Room, and the Jonquil Room all receiving a fresh coat of paint. The work was completed by McCall Painting. These three rooms are the most used spaces in the Community Center. They host business events, weddings, birthdays, anniversaries, along with many other city events. The painting will be an appreciated update for future visitors.

PUBLIC WORKS

San Fernando Water Main Replacement:

The San Fernando Water Main Replacement Project is now complete.

Inglewood Drive Water Line Project: The Inglewood Drive Water Line is being tested for water quality.

Woodbury Subdivision Meter Installation:

The Water Department installed new meters in the Woodbury Subdivision on Bell Drive.



Close Caption TV Sewer Project: The sewer project for CCTV and cleaning is ongoing in Ward 4. Federal EC is performing the work for the City of Smyrna. This project will help ensure the life span of the current sewer system. Management has been reviewing videos of the deteriorating VCP (clay pipe) infrastructure to be lined. The project is currently 97% complete.

High Parc Subdivision Meter Installation: The Water Department installed new water meters at High Parc Subdivision.

Fire Hydrant Replacement: The Water Department replaced a fire hydrant on North Cooper Lake Road.

Afton Downs Curb and Gutter Project: The outer loop of the Afton Downs Curb and Gutter Project has been completed.

Brick Recycling: The delivery of the recycled brick from the Downtown Redesign Project has been delivered to Lifecycle Building Center.

Wheelchair Ramp Installation: The Streets Department installed a new wheelchair ramp at Cottesford Drive.

Storm Water Top Repairs: The Streets Department repaired broken storm water tops at the Oaks of Concord subdivision and on Dunn Street.

Retention Pond Cleaning: The Streets Department cleaned the retention pond behind Fire Station 2.

Monthly Mowing List: The Streets Department continued to mow at various locations on the monthly mowing list.

Recycling Center Relay Race: On Friday, June 11, 12 kids and parents from Kids Care, a nonprofit volunteer group for kids, toured the Smyrna Recycling Center and participated in our first-ever recycling relay race!

Summer Camp at the Recycling Center: On Monday, June 13, 24 campers and 4 counselors from Smyrna Parks and Recreation Summer Camp visited the Smyrna Recycling Center to learn about recycling and participate in a papermaking activity.



ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES



Community Cleanups: On Tuesday, June 7, Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up 60 pounds of litter, including 24 pounds of recycling and 173 cigarette butts, during a Community Cleanup on Village Parkway. That same day, 18 youth and 3 adults from Project Future picked up three bags of litter during an independent litter cleanup on Windy Hill Road. As part of their summer program service project, this group will do litter cleanups around Smyrna every other week through the middle of July.



Litter Free Events: On Saturday, Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers handed out 178 trash bags at the Smyrna Summer Concert and collected 64 pounds of recycling to ensure the concert was a litter-free event.

Recycling Center: In May, the recycling center processed a total of 96,452 pounds of material and had 2,205 patrons. As of June 14, the center has processed 49,346 pounds of material so far this month. The recycling center has processed a total of 560,084 pounds of material in 2022.
