ADMINISTRATION

CDBG Home Repair Program: Applications are now being accepted for the new Home Repair Program funded through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). Rebuilding Together Atlanta was awarded the bid to administer the program on behalf of the city. Rebuilding Together Atlanta is a local nonprofit organization that leads efforts in making high risk homes safe and healthy. The goal of the program is to assist low-income Smyrna homeowners with minor home repairs, allowing them to live safely in their homes. The pilot program allocates \$50,000 from program year 2021 CDBG funding with a maximum \$10,000 grant per household. Smyrna Officers Receive MADD Organization **Awards:** Each year the Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) organization recognizes officers from around the state for their exceptional work on DUI enforcement. This year Officer Trail received a bronze pin for making 34 DUI arrests in 2021. Officer Khan received the prestigious red pin for making 151 DUI arrests in 2021. Officer Khan also received a DUI Hero Award for having the second most DUI arrests from an agency in category 4 (75-100 officers). Officer Mordaunt also received the prestigious red pin for making 175 DUI arrests in 2021. Officer Mordaunt received the first place DUI Hero Award for having the most DUI arrests in a category 4 agency. All three of these officers should be recognized for their dedication to their craft and relentless work ethic.



ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES



Recycling Center: Last Friday, five residents joined the June monthly tour of the Smyrna Recycling Center to learn more about their recycling options in Smyrna and how to be better recyclers. Litter Index: Keep Smyrna Beautiful board members and staff are completing the annual litter index this week. A requirement of Keep America Beautiful, the litter index is a way to visually assess current litter conditions. Board and staff members drive through predesignated roads in each ward of the city and score them based on the amount of litter present.

Adopt-a-Mile: On Saturday, fourteen volunteers from Kappa Alpha Psi cleaned up their mile on both sides of South Cobb Drive (from 285 to Cobb Industrial Boulevard). They picked up 12 bags of litter, totaling approximately 180 pounds.








Community Cleanups: On Saturday, five Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up litter on Freeman Parkway in Ward 7, taking in 72 total pounds of litter, including 22 pounds of recycling.

PUBLIC WORKS

Hard Work and Rising Temperatures: With temperatures reaching above 100 degrees and warmer days to come, Smyrna Public Works employees have been busy keeping projects up to date as well as doing whatever they can to stay cool and safe. Heat illness is a dangerous condition, and it can lead to severe health issues and even death if not addressed in a timely manner. As always, the Smyrna Public Works Department makes safety a priority. The City of Smyrna supplies staff with water coolers for the trucks stocked with ice, Gatorade, and water to make sure that there are plenty of fluids available to replenish lost electrolytes. For further safety and comfort, Public Works has purchased chill pads and protective hats. Even in the summer heat, Public Works employees have continued to work hard at maintaining the city.

Fleet Maintenance: Public Works mechanics have been diligently working on making vehicle repairs. They recently made 47 vehicle and equipment repairs on sanitation and fire trucks, and also repairs on gas powered pumps.

Close Circuit TV Sewer Project: The sewer project for CCTV and cleaning is ongoing in Ward 4. Federal EC is preforming the work for the City of Smyrna. This project will help ensure the life span of the current sewer system. Management has been reviewing videos of the deteriorating VCP (clay pipe) infrastructure to be lined. The project is currently 97% complete.






Inglewood Drive Water Main Project: The Inglewood Drive water main has passed the water quality test.

Church Street Water Main Project: The Church Street water main has been installed and and it will be tested next week.

Water Service Line Repair: A broken water system service line was repaired on Roswell Street. The primary function of a water system service line is to provide end-users with potable water and a sufficient water pressure level.

Fire Hydrant Replacement: A fire hydrant on Collier Drive was updated and relocated as part of a sidewalk improvement project. A fire hydrant is a visible connection point that is placed in defined locations for firefighters to tap into a water supply.
