

LIBRARY AND MUSEUM

Back to School (in 1948): Smyrna Library recently acquired a talisman yearbook from Smyrna High School for the 1948-49 academic year. All four class officers are common surnames around Smyrna to this day!

Staff Development: Part-time Adult Services staff member, Jennifer Moore, attended a workshop on July 26 at the Cobb County Law Library. The class gave Jennifer insight into the small claims court process and acquainted her with the resources available at the Law Library.

PUBLIC WORKS

Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water/Sewer Department has been replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services around the city. This work has taken place on Inglewood Drive, San Fernando Drive, and Church Street. Public Works staff and management selected these areas for replacement due to the number of leaks and breaks in the area in addition to the integrity of the pipes. The Water/Sewer Department is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. All water mains have been completed with the exception of landscaping.

Citywide Meter Change Out Project: The citywide meter change out project is ongoing. The contactor for this project placed magnets on the side of their trucks stating "Contractor for the City of Smyrna" to ensure that customers feel safe.

Master Meter Installation: Ardito Construction is currently installing a master meter for the Kiddie Academy on South Cobb Drive.

Water Line Rehabilitation Project: Ardito Construction is preparing to begin work on the Highlands Road water line rehabilitation project.

Manhole Cleaning and Repairs: Smyrna sewer crews have been inspecting sewer lines to repair broken manhole lids and to clean and paint around the manholes.

Close Circuit TV Pipe Project: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with our sewer Close Circuit TV equipment. This equipment helps to grade the condition of the pipe and the flow capacity. This technology allows the sewer crews to view the lines in real time, then video review the pipe to determine the condition and flow. Staff will grade areas that need attention and correct the issues using the jet truck. This project is still in progress and is now being extended to Ward 5. Wards 1 and 4 have been completed.



Fire Hydrant Repairs: Smyrna water crews made repairs to a broken fire hydrant on Eastfield Road last week.

Road Paving Project: Ardito Construction is currently in the process of lowering manholes and valves on streets that will be paved in the near future.

PUBLIC WORKS

Standard Operating Procedure Class: The Water/Sewer Department held a standard operating procedure class this week on ways to cut on water mains after breaks, turning customers water back on, and city policies. This class was held in efforts to keep all employees up to date on current policies and procedures. The Water/Sewer Department would like to thank Jason Winters and Guy Kirkwood for leading the class.



Streets Department Projects: The Streets Department worked on various projects last week including:

- Repairing a pedestrian access issue on Concord Road
- Repairing a drainage problem on Durley Lane
- Continuing work on the Collier Drive sidewalk project
- Finishing concrete work on the St. Charles Drive curb and gutter project
- Repairing asphalt at Gordon Circle, Floyd Road, Marston Street, and North Cooper Lake Road
- Cutting and trimming the right of way at the Cooper Lake Road Sidewalk
- Continuing work on the monthly right of way mowing schedule






PARKS AND RECREATION

Rivers Alive: Keep Smyrna Beautiful's annual river cleanup coordinated in partnership with Cobb Water, Keep Marietta Beautiful, and Keep Cobb Beautiful will take place on Saturday, September 10. Volunteers can register at: https://tinyurl.com/3b2p5cka

Recycling Center: The center processed 130,332 pounds of material in July, bringing the total amount of material processed so far in 2022 to 731,326 pounds. The center is currently projected to recycle over 1.2 million pounds of material in 2022.



ENVIRONMENAL SERVICES

Paint Recycling: The recycling center began accepting paint for recycling on Tuesday. On the first day, about 80 gallons of paint were collected. There are a few strict guidelines that patrons will need to follow, and fees are associated with recycling.

Adopt-a-Mile: The final numbers are in! This July, 85 Adopt-a-Mile volunteers cleaned up 19 miles of Smyrna roadways, picking up 71 bags of litter totaling 1,065 pounds. Total this year, Adopt-a-Mile groups have picked up 3,765 pounds of litter to help keep Smyrna clean, green, and beautiful! The last Adopt-a-Mile cleanup for this year is scheduled for October 15, 2022. Starting in September, Keep Smyrna Beautiful will hold monthly lunchtime Adopt-a-Mile info sessions for prospective groups. ENGINEERING



Traffic Signal Update at South Cobb Drive and Church Road: The traffic signal update at the intersection of South Cobb Drive and Church Road/Church Street was activated on August 2. This signal is a part of a Georgia Department of Traffic Transportation/Regional Operations Professionals project that will update four traffic signals along South Cobb Drive with flashing yellow arrows. The scope of work included the installation of 4-section signal heads with flashing yellow arrows on all approaches, replacing the existing 3-section signal heads, setting new timber poles, relocating the traffic signal cabinet, and street sign updates. The remaining signals to be updated include: SR 280 at Concord Village Plaza, and SR 280 at Cooper Lake Road. SR 280 at Concord Village Plaza is scheduled to be activated on August 4.

ENGINEERING





Protected Left Turn Arrow Installation at Atlanta Road and Creatwood Trail: A protected left turn arrow was installed for the northbound left turns at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Creatwood Trail. The existing 3-section signal head was replaced with a 5-section signal head and programmed on August 1. This left turn arrow was warranted based on an analysis conducted in 2019 that analyzed traffic counts, crash records, and signal timing. The request for a left-turn signal phase was in response to concerns regarding safety for the northbound left turns from Atlanta Road on to Creatwood Trail.

Restriping at the Heritage at Vinings Subdivision: All of the deteriorated stop bars and crosswalks within the Heritage at Vinings subdivision were restriped with thermoplastic. The work included restriping at the subdivision entrance on Atlanta Road and Millwood Trail and at 5 stop sign locations within the subdivision.



School Zone Flashing Beacons: With the start of Cobb County Schools on Monday, Traffic Engineering has been actively inspecting the school flashing beacons to ensure that the schedule for the 2022–23 school year is programmed and that all beacons are flashing accordingly. All of the beacons are working as scheduled with the exception of one for Campbell Middle School facing southbound traffic on Atlanta Road (due to a power failure). The Traffic Department is working closely with the power company to resolve this issue.
