His mosaic paintings are on display at the library through the end of August.


FIRE DEPARTMENT

Smyrna Fire Department Drone Program: The Smyrna Fire Department has started taking the first steps in establishing a drone program to assist in their fire response. Many neighboring fire departments have seen the value in this new technology, which allows for greater visualization of the emergency site and includes thermal imagery all from the safety of a hovering drone. This clearer picture will allow fire officers to make well informed decisions on how to get the fire out as quickly and safely as possible. The program is also set to assist in a number of other fire department operations as well.

PUBLIC WORKS

Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water/Sewer Department has been replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services around the city. This work has taken place on Inglewood Drive, San Fernando Drive, and Church Street. Staff selected these areas for replacement due to the number of leaks and breaks in the area in addition to the integrity of the pipes. The Water/Sewer Department is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. All water mains have been completed with the exception of landscaping.

Citywide Meter Change Out Project: The citywide meter change out project is ongoing. The contactor for this project placed magnets on the side of their trucks stating "Contractor for the City of Smyrna" to ensure that customers feel safe.

Water Line Replacement: Ardito Construction is currently completing the final stages of a water line replacement project at Riverline Park.

Manhole Cleaning and Repairs: Smyrna Sewer crews have been inspecting sewer lines to repair broken manhole lids and to clean and paint around the manholes.

Pre-Incident Planning: The Water/Sewer Department attended a pre-incident planning meeting with the Smyrna Fire Department in efforts to gather backflow information throughout the city.

Training at the University of Georgia: The Director and Assistant Director of Public Works will soon be attending the UGA training for certified public works management.

Closed Circuit TV Pipe Project: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with our sewer Closed Circuit TV equipment. This equipment helps to grade the condition of the pipe and the flow capacity. This technology allows the sewer crews to view the lines in real time, then video review the pipe to determine the condition and flow. Staff will grade areas that need attention and correct the issues using the jet truck. This project is still in progress and is now being extended to Ward 5. Wards 1 and 4 have been completed.



Road Paving Project: Ardito Construction is currently in the process of lowering manholes and valves on streets that will be paved in the near future.





ENGINEERING



Traffic Signal Repair at Spring Road at Campbell Road:

A mast arm assembly was damaged during a traffic incident at the intersection of Spring Road at Campbell Road. The mast arm assembly faced eastbound traffic on Spring Road. It has been temporarily replaced with a wooden pole at the southeast corner of the intersection. The Traffic Department is gathering parts to reinstall the mast arm and anticipate the work being scheduled within the next few weeks. This traffic incident damaged the signal pole, traffic signal heads, signage, and CCTV cameras.

Traffic Signal Flashing Yellow Arrow Updates: Updates to the traffic signals at the intersections of South Cobb Drive at The Crossings/Concord Village Plaza, and South Cobb Drive at Concord Road, were activated on August 4 and August 9. These signals are part of a Georgia Department of Transportation/Regional Traffic Operations Professionals project that will update 5 traffic signals along South Cobb Drive with flashing yellow arrows (FYAs). Previous intersections completed include SR 280 at King Springs Road, and SR 280 at Church Road. The remaining intersection to be updated is South Cobb Drive at Cooper Lake Road. FYAs will be installed for traffic headed southbound on SR 280 and for both approaches on Concord Road, in addition to all approaches at the intersection of SR 280 at The Crossings. The project also includes updates to street signs and pedestrian signs.

SR 280 Resurfacing Project: The City of Smyrna Traffic Department is coordinating with the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) for a project consisting of 8.045 miles of milling, interlay, and plant mix resurfacing on SR 280 beginning at the Fulton County line and extending north of Austell Road. The section of roadway being resurfaced within Smyrna city limits begins at the I-285 ramps and ends at Pat Mell Road. A meeting was held on August 9 to verify the traffic inductive loops (used for vehicle detection) that will be damaged during the resurfacing. All damaged traffic loops and roadway striping will be replaced by GDOT. The project is scheduled to kick-off before the end of August and is anticipated to be completed before the end of the year.

School Flashing Beacons: The school flashing beacon for Campbell Middle School facing traffic traveling southbound on Atlanta Road is repaired and flashing on schedule. All school flashers have been updated with new 4G controllers and modems.
