Friends News: The Friends of Smyrna Library have been preparing for the upcoming Children's Book Sale. They had another busy day on Saturday, August 20, pricing over 3,000 books. The hours for the sale are Saturday, August 27 from 10 AM-4 PM, and Sunday, August 28 from 1-4 PM. Prices will range from \$1-\$5.

PUBLIC WORKS

Sewer Pump Maintenance: Maintenance was done on the sewer pump station for the Water/Sewer Department. This maintenance was done to lift the station up and get the station running at a normal volume.

Waterline Replacement Project: KM Davis will be starting a Stone Creek Drive waterline replacement project this week to remove old galvanized pipes out of the system.



Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water/Sewer Department has been replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services around the city. This work has taken place on Inglewood Drive, San Fernando Drive, and Church Street. Staff selected these areas for replacement due to the number of leaks and breaks in the area in addition to the integrity of the pipes. The Water/Sewer Department is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. All water mains have been completed with the exception of landscaping.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Project: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with our sewer closed-circuit TV equipment. This equipment helps to grade the condition of the pipe and the flow capacity. This technology allows the sewer crews to view the lines in real time, then video review the pipe to determine the condition and flow. Staff will grade areas that need attention and correct the issues using the jet truck. This project is still in progress and is now being extended to Ward 5. Wards 1 and 4 have been completed.



Water/Sewer Informational Class: Water/Sewer crew members attended a class and demonstration on spray nozzles for their Jeet machine and vacuum truck. This class was hosted by Environmental Products Group.

Driveway Apron Installation: KM Davis is installing driveway aprons for a project on Church Street.


New Entryway at Durham Park:

In addition, staff repaired irrigation heads, filled holes in front of the pitching rubbers, and drug the infields. This maintenance is in preparation for the upcoming little league season.

Community Cleanups: Last Wednesday, two Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up 112 pounds of litter, including 18 pounds of recyclables, on East-West Connector as part of a Community Cleanup.

Great Pollinator Census: On August 19, three volunteers gathered at the Smyrna Community Garden, where we hosted a census site for the Great Georgia Pollinator Census. Volunteers counted pollinators for a designated period of time, and we uploaded the information to an online database that will be utilized by scientists who study pollinators. Keep Smyrna Beautiful also handed out ten educational pollinator craft kits to families at North Cooper Lake Park. Fifty more of the kits were handed out to kids at the Smyrna Public Library.







Recycling Center: On Friday, two patrons (who also happened to be Keep Smyrna Beautiful board members!) took part in the monthly Recycling Center tour. While there were some last-minute cancellations, the small group gave extra time for discussion and lots of questions! New Paint Program: The Recycling Center's new paint program continues to be a successful resource for residents. They have collected approximately 250 gallons of paint since August 2.

ENGINEERING







Infrastructure Repairs: The Engineering Department has been working to repair damage to various infrastructures caused by traffic accidents. The traffic signal cabinet at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Windy Hill Road was damaged during a traffic accident on August 10 and is now repaired. A rectangular rapid flashing beacon (RRFB) pedestrian crossing was damaged during a traffic incident on Lake Park Drive on August 20. This RRFB repair is underway. Two pedestrian signals were damaged during a traffic incident at the intersection of SR 280 and The Crossings. These pedestrian signals have been replaced. However, the Engineering Department is working with Georgia Department of Transportation to rewire the signals. They are bagged until the rewiring is complete.

Roadway Striping: Striping was completed for the crosswalks, stop bars, and hatching around the medians at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Spring Road/Concord Road. This striping is intended to enhance the visibility of pedestrians crossing the intersection. Engineering has restriped the crosswalks at other intersections along Atlanta Road that have faded over time, including W. Spring Street, Fleming Street/Hawthorne Avenue, and Church Street.

New Pedestrian Signals: Pedestrian signals are being installed at the intersection of Concord Road and Old Concord Road. A total of 3 pedestrian signals will be installed to allow pedestrians to safely cross the northern and western legs of the intersection. The bases for the signals have been poured and the final assembly is expected to be completed by the end of August.





Overhead Signage Updates: The overhead regulatory signs at the intersection of South Cobb Drive and Concord Road were adjusted to align with the traffic lanes.
