**Pre-Pandemic Attendance:** With the added foot traffic from the Friends Book Sale, the library saw its highest weekly attendance since before the pandemic.

Friends Fundraising: For the first time, the Friends of Smyrna Library sponsored a used book sale focusing on children and teen materials. The event was a big hit. They raised a record-breaking \$2100 over the weekend. The funds have been earmarked for a new collection of "Wonderbooks" for the youth collection. Wonderbooks combine a book and an audiobook into one physical material. With the decline in people owning CD players, there has been a lot of interest in this new format.

### **LIBRARY AND MUSEUM**





**Sesquicentennial Event:** Smyrna Museum and Smyrna Library are hosting several events this fall in celebration of Smyrna's 150th birthday. "Smyrna History on Wheels" is a driving tour which will visit about ten historic locations around Smyrna. The tour will be presented twice on Saturday, September 10 at 10:30 AM and 2:00 PM. **Cemetery Cleanup:** The Smyrna Museum hosted another Cemetery Cleanup event last week. Three volunteers helped clean over 21 monuments at Smyrna Memorial Cemetery. The images below are of the Thrash monument shown with the foaming action of the cleaner and the results.





### **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Waterline Replacement Project:** KM Davis will be starting a waterline replacement project on Stone Creek Drive this week to remove old galvanized pipes out of the system.

**Ward 4 Sewer Mains:** Sewer mains with root intrusion have been treated with root control foam. This foam will rot the roots, allowing flow to eventually erode the root balls and time for staff to evaluate and address the areas that need major repairs.





**Water Valve Maintenance:** Crews are performing valve maintenance in Wards 4 and 5 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings. This helps staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise. This project is 10% complete.

**Closed Circuit TV Pipe Inspection:** The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment that grades the condition of the pipe and flow capacity. This technology allows sewer crews to view lines in real time and determine if the pipe condition or flow is being impeded. Pipe inspections cut down on fuel costs, repairs, and maintenance to our emergency sewer equipment such as the jet truck and video inspection equipment. Staff will grade each ward and areas that need attention will be addressed. This project is 30% complete and is being extended to Ward 5. Wards 1 and 2 have been completed.

**Water Main and Service Replacement:** The Water/Sewer Department is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. The Highlands waterline project began this week starting with Dundee Drive. Signs are displayed to notify customers. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff due to the number of leaks and breaks or the integrity of the pipe. The Water/Sewer Department is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. This project is 5% complete.

**Streets Department Projects:** The Streets Department has been hard at work on the following projects:

- Landscaping for the Collier Drive sidewalk project
- Continuing the Afton Way curb and gutter project
- Landscaping for the St. Charles Drive curb and gutter project
- Resolving line of sight issues on Powder Springs Street and Church Street
- Continuing work on the monthly right of way mowing list

### **ENGINEERING**



**Traffic Loop Repairs:** Repairs were made to the traffic loops near the office complex at 1955 Lake Park Drive. Repair is also underway for a damaged traffic loop on Hurt Road at the intersection with Concord Road. The pull box replacement and the rewiring for this approach is completed. These traffic inductive loops are a method used to detect the presence of vehicles at an intersection, which in turn prompts the traffic signal.

**Signal Light Replacements:** The red traffic signal light for the left turn arrow was replaced for the westbound approach at Lake Park Drive and Woodlands Drive. Signal lights were also replaced for the I-285 ramps.
