

Education and Outreach: On Friday, Keep Smyrna Beautiful visited the entire third grade at Belmont Hills Elementary to present "There Is No Away," an environmental education curriculum that explores what "away" means when you throw something in the trash, recycle it, or when it is littered. The students had a great time with the Litter Timeline activity where they had to match each item with the amount of time it takes to decompose.

Community Cleanups: Last Thursday, seven volunteers picked up 176 pounds of litter, including 58 pounds of recyclables, on Windy Hill Road and Dixie Avenue. We were alerted to the litter on Dixie Avenue by a resident who filled out our online litter reporting form.

ENGINEERING



New Pedestrian Signals: New pedestrian signals are installed at the intersection of Concord Road and Old Concord Road. The signals serve pedestrians crossing the western leg of Concord Road and Old Concord Road. This intersection was listed as a project by the city's Traffic Calming Committee.

Atlanta Road at Powder Springs Street Traffic Signal: The decorative mast arm assembly has been set for the traffic signal at Atlanta Road and Powder Springs Street. This signal was included as part of the Downtown Redevelopment Project. This assembly will replace the wooden poles that supported the temporary signal. The permanent signal is expected to be operational within the next month. Redwick is the signal contractor for this project.

Temporary Road Access Closure/Reroute Notice: There will be a two-week closure to left turns to and from Windy Hill at Ward Street for construction beginning Saturday, September 17 and concluding Sunday, October 2. The second week coincides with Cobb County School District's fall break. As shown on the pictured exhibit, when the crossover is closed to traffic, westbound traffic wishing to turn left onto Ward Street will proceed to the next crossover and make a U-turn. Traffic northbound on Ward Street wishing to turn left onto Windy Hill Road will be directed eastbound to Belmont Place where they can make a U-turn to travel westbound. Eastbound movements on Windy Hill Road at Ward Street are not affected by the temporary closure.

PUBLIC WORKS

Streets Department Projects: The Streets Department worked on various projects this week:

- Continued work on the Afton Downs curb and gutter project
- Removed stormwater obstructions from creeks at Austin Lake Drive and Vinings North Drive
- Repaired asphalt on Prince Road and Springwood Drive
- Trimmed right of way obstructions on Hawthorne Avenue, Old Roswell Road, and Anderson Circle
- Continued working on monthly right of way mowing and trimming list

PUBLIC WORKS

Crews to the Rescue: Crews have been hard at work responding to sewer main and service backups and attending to work orders around the city.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment that grades the condition of the pipe and flow capacity. This technology allows sewer crews to view lines in real time and determine if the pipe condition or flow is being impeded. Pipe inspections cut down on fuel costs, repairs, and maintenance to our emergency sewer equipment such as the jet truck and video inspection equipment. Staff will grade each ward and areas that need attention will be addressed. This project is being extended to Wards 4 and 5. Wards 1 and 2 have been completed.





Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water/Sewer Department is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. The Highlands waterline project is in progress. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff due to the number of leaks and breaks or the integrity of the pipe. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. This project is 7% complete.

Water Main Installation: KM Davis completed a water main installation on Stone Creek Drive to remove old galvanized pipes out of the system. Landscaping and roadway repairs will be scheduled to complete the project. This project is 98% complete.

Water Valve Maintenance: Crews are performing valve maintenance in Wards 4 and 5 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise. This project is 15% complete.
