



Annual Jonquil Bulb Sale: The annual Keep Smyrna Beautiful Jonquil Bulb Sale is continuing! Bulbs can be purchased at the Smyrna Recycling Center and at the Keep Smyrna Beautiful booth at the Crafts & Drafts Festival on October 29 and 30. Community Cleanups: On Sunday, September 25, a group from Ismaili CIVIC completed a community cleanup on South Cobb Drive as part of their Global Ismaili CIVIC Day. The volunteer group picked up litter on South Cobb Drive between King Springs Road and Concord Road.





Document Shredding: Keep Smyrna Beautiful's bi-annual document shredding event was on Saturday, September 24. There were 302 participants resulting in 11,940 pounds of documents shredded.

PUBLIC WORKS

Streets Department Projects: The Streets Department has been hard at work on the following projects:

- Continuing Afton Downs curb and gutter project
- Repaired sidewalk on Roswell Street and Campbell Road
- Continuing work on Austin Lakes/Lake Court Park drainage project
- Trimmed right of way on Hawthorne Avenue, Davenport Street, Old Spring Road, Burbank Drive, Inglewood Drive and San Fernando Drive
- Continued work on monthly right of way mowing list

Water Valve Maintenance: Crews are performing valve maintenance in Wards 4 and 5 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise. This project is 40% complete.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows sewer crews to view lines in real time and determine if the pipe condition or flow is being impeded. Pipe inspections cut down on fuel costs, repairs, and maintenance to our emergency sewer equipment such as the jet truck and video inspection equipment. Staff will grade each ward and areas that need attention will be addressed. The contractor is currently in Ward 4 and the project is being extended to Ward 5. Wards 1 and 2 have been completed. The project is 91% complete.

Highlands Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water/Sewer Department is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. The Highlands waterline project is in progress. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff for leaks and breaks. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. This project is 10% complete.

Argo Road Water Main Replacement: A meeting was held with the contractor last week to replace the Argo Road water main. Locates are to be called in to start the replacement process the last week of September.

Stone Creek Drive Water Main Installation: KM Davis completed a water main installation on Stone Creek Drive to remove old galvanized pipes out of the system. Landscaping and roadway repairs will be scheduled to complete the project. This project is 99% complete.
