PUBLIC WORKS





Water Main and Service Repairs: Staff has had a busy week repairing water mains and water services due to the weather change. Pictured left is staff member Joseph Humphreys repairing a water main break on Powder Springs Street.

Streets Department Projects: The Streets Department has been hard at work on the following projects:

- Completed landscaping associated with the Austin Lake drainage project
- Continued work on Dixie Avenue sidewalk project
- Continued work on monthly right of way mowing list

Emergency Water Service Repair: Durrell Ross and fellow staff members (pictured right) made emergency repairs on a service line that broke and caused a customer to have no water on Roswell Street last Friday.

Leak Detection: As part of the yearly water loss prevention project, water distribution is currently conducting leak detection in Ward 4. Staff will be in this area for the next two weeks ensuring there are no hidden water leaks. Without proper leak detection, millions of gallons could be lost due to small leaks that are not visible on aging systems.

Preparing for Paving: Ardito Construction started lowering manholes and valves on Vineyard Way, Bordeau Walk, and Woodale Drive for paving to begin on October 24.





Water Valve Maintenance: Crews are performing valve maintenance in Wards 4 and 5 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise. This project is 55% complete.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows sewer crews to view lines in real time and determine if the pipe condition or flow is being impeded. Pipe inspections cut down on fuel costs, repairs, and maintenance to our emergency sewer equipment such as the jet truck and video inspection equipment. Staff will grade each ward and areas that need attention will be addressed. The contractor is currently in Ward 4 and the project is being extended to Ward 5. Wards 1 and 2 have been completed. The project is 93% complete.

Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water/Sewer Department is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff for leaks and breaks. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. Three projects are currently active as part of this program:

- Highlands Water Main Replacement: This project has been ongoing for three weeks and is 15% complete. This area consists of roughly one mile of water main replacement in addition to 81 service connections.
- Argo Road Water Main Replacement: Locates are to be called in to start the replacement process this month.
- Stone Creek Drive Water Main Installation: Landscaping and roadway repairs will be scheduled. This project is 99% complete.
