

# **ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES**

## **LIBRARY AND MUSEUM**

New Wonderbooks Collection: In November, Smyrna Library added a new collection of special materials for beginning readers called "Wonderbooks." These books are similar to book/audio CD kits we currently offer, but fewer families have access to CD players than in the past. Wonderbooks have a playable audio copy of the story attached to the book, so no special equipment is needed to listen and read. This special collection was funded through a combination of donations from the Friends of Smyrna Library, a donation from Judge Cindy Morris in memory of her mother and former Library Director Doris Morris, and a small donation from the Modern Woodmen of America. The library has 54 picture books in this new collection and plans to expand it in 2023.

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

## **Holiday Sanitation Schedule**

The sanitation schedule for the week of November 21 is as follows:

- Monday and Tuesday routes remain unchanged
- Thursday and Friday routes will be picked up on Wednesday

There will be no yard waste or large item pickup due to the holidays.



**Sewer Service Tap Replacement:** Staff replaced a sewer service tap on Queens Gate Drive due to roots growing into the pipe.

Water Valve Maintenance: Crews are performing valve maintenance in Wards 4 and 5 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise.

**Water Main and Service Replacement:** The Water/Sewer Department is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff for leaks and breaks. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. The following locations are in progress:

- Highlands Water Main Replacement (Dundee Drive now complete)
- Argo Road Water Main Replacement



# **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Meter Dial Change Out:** The Utility Service Department has been changing out meter dials around the city to ensure accurate meter readings and water billing.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: The Water/Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real-time and determine pipe conditions. Staff is currently marking the direction of flow around manholes.







**Congratulations:** We would like to congratulate John Bramlett (left) and Jason Winters (right) for completing the Management Development Program hosted by the Carl Vinson Institute of Government. This is a year-long class that helps supervisors learn how to interact and grow with their staff.





**Confined Space Class:** Water and Sewer staff attended a confined space class. Some employees attended the class for the first time, and other employees attended to get re-certified. This certification allows employees to gain the knowledge to perform work in a confined space when needed.

**Streets Department Projects:** The Streets Department has been hard at work on the following projects:

- Repairing the sidewalk on Atlanta Road in front of Montclair Subdivision
- Removing driveway aprons on Fleming Street and replacing them with curbs and sidewalk
- Repairing asphalt on Spring Street, Eastfield Road, Pierce Avenue, Powder Springs Street, and Brentwood Drive
- Trimming bushes and limbs to fix the line of sight issues at Fire Station 5
- Reviewing and cutting (as needed) on the monthly right-of-way mowing list

## **ENGINEERING**

**Traffic Signal Flashing Yellow Arrow Updates:** The traffic signal at the intersection of South Cobb Drive and Cooper Lake Road was updated on November 9. The update included flashing yellow arrows for the left turn on all approaches and relocation of the traffic signal cabinet. This was the last signal to be upgraded as part of the Georgia Department of Transportation/Regional Traffic Operations Professionals project along SR 280. Previous intersections completed include SR 280 and King Springs Road, SR 280 and Church Road, SR 280 and The Crossings/Concord Village, and South Cobb Drive and Concord Road. BB&H was the contractor for this project.







**School Zone Flashing Beacon Relocation:** One of the school zone speed limit signs for Argyle Elementary was relocated approximately 230 feet south on Campbell Road. This school limit sign was relocated to construct a right turn/deceleration lane for the development at Spring Road and Campbell Road.

**Infrastructure Repairs:** The red flashing beacon was repaired for the southbound approach at the intersection of Campbell Road and Nancy Circle. The flashing beacon is placed above the stop sign to alert drivers of the all-way stop at this intersection. New cameras were installed for all approaches at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Windy Hill Road to improve video detection.

**Speed Study Requests:** Radar signs have been deployed to collect traffic speed and volume data for speed study requests on Old Concord Road (near Glendale Place/Smyrna Grove entrance), Lynhurst Road, and the Vinings Estates Subdivision (data is being collected on Vinings Estates Drive and Whitehaven Park Lane).


