

The Fielding Lewis Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution visited Smyrna Library on November 21 to donate new books to the library's genealogy collection. The books provide information to patrons researching Revolutionary War veteran ancestors and Native American ancestors.



PUBLIC WORKS

Water Main Breaks: Water and Sewer Department crews resolved multiple water main breaks last week on Winding Valley Drive, Alpine Drive, and Wisteria Drive.

Meter Dial Change Out: The Utility Services Department has been changing out meter dials around the city to ensure accurate meter readings and billing.







Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: The Water and Sewer Department is currently grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real-time and determine pipe conditions. Staff is currently marking the direction of flow around manholes.

Water Main Backups: Over Thanksgiving break, sewer crews resolved two sewer main backups on Roswell Street and Tecumseh Trail. Pictured right are before and after pictures of one of the backups.





Water Main and Service Replacement: The Water and Sewer Department is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff for leaks and breaks. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community. The following locations are in progress:

- Highlands Water Main Replacement (Dundee Drive now complete)
- Argo Road Water Main Replacement (This section of the project recently passed the water test and new services are currently being tied in.)

PUBLIC WORKS

Water Valve Maintenance: Crews are performing valve maintenance in Ward 4 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise.

Monthly Readings for Billing: The Utility Services Department started monthly meter readings for billing on November 28. Readings will take roughly three days to complete. Meter readings allow for edits to be made before the billing process begins.


