Smyrna Recycling Center: On December 8, the recycling center was recognized for its collaboration and work by Keep Cobb Beautiful (KCB) at their 2022 Volunteer Appreciation Event with the Recycling Partnership Award! The recycling center and Keep Smyrna Beautiful have partnered with KCB since 2021 for the Hefty EnergyBag Program. It was the first drop off facility in the state to collect Hefty EnergyBags and continues to work with our county affiliate to increase recycling efforts and education.

Bike Course Resurfacing: Parks Maintenance staff is working on resurfacing the mountain bike course at North Cooper Lake Park. The two slopestyle runs in the center of the park have worn areas from riders and weather. Soil is being added and worked into place with a ride-on-track loader. A soil stabilizer will be applied to bind the clay into place once the trails are smoothed and packed. The resurfacing will make the bike course safe for all riders that visit the park





Chess Classes: Smyrna Parks and Recreation and Burdnest Inc. will be hosting beginner chess classes for children ages 8-13 years old starting in January 2023. Classes will consist of 4 six-week sessions covering the basics of chess and how to incorporate lessons learned through chess into the children's everyday lives.
