

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Streets Department Projects:** The Streets Department has been working on the following projects:

- Continuing work on the Pat Mell Road sidewalk project
- Completed an elevated crosswalk on Powder Springs Street at Campbell High School (pictured right)
- Worked with the Water and Sewer Department on emergency calls and de-icing roadways
- Completed the drainage project on Valley Drive



# WATER DISTRIBUTION

**Staff Spotlight:** On-call crews worked through the holidays repairing main breaks. They were dispatched to over 40 calls about the severe cold weather. The city had six major main breaks throughout the city, including our city buildings. Staff put in more hours in four days than an average person would in two 40-hour work weeks. A huge thank you goes out to all the staff that pulled together and missed the holidays with their families to ensure that citizens and properties were well taken care of.



**Water Main and Service Replacement:** Staff is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. Areas are selected after being reviewed by staff for leaks and breaks. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community.

- Highlands Water Main Replacement: Dundee Drive section is complete
- Argo Road Water Main Replacement: Complete
- Roswell Street Water Main Replacement: Phase one has begun from Spring Street to Old Roswell Street

**Water Valve Maintenance:** Crews are performing valve maintenance in Ward 4 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise. Projects will be ongoing through 2023.

**Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection:** Staff is grading sewer infrastructure with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time and determine pipe conditions. Staff is marking the direction of flow around manholes. Staff worked on monthly problem areas this week. These monthly areas will be visited by staff for one week every month until the problem areas can be remediated. The staff has taken the monthly list from 36 areas to 19.





### **Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacon Installation:**

The rapid rectangular flashing beacon assembly is complete for the pedestrian crossing at Atlanta Road and Creatwood Trail. The assembly includes double-sided pedestrian crossing signs along with double-sided flashing beacons to alert drivers when a pedestrian is crossing.



**Overhead Flashing Beacon Repair:** An overhead flashing beacon was damaged at the intersection of King Springs Road and Reed Road. The repair included replacing the signal and rewiring.


