ENGINEERING





Traffic Signage and Striping: Chevrons were striped for the new raised pedestrian crosswalk on Powder Springs Street near Campbell High School and the existing raised pedestrian crosswalk on Church Road near Lachlan Drive. Raised pavement markers were also installed to enhance the visibility of the pedestrian crosswalks. Chevron alignment signs were installed along the curve on Concord Road between King Street and Medlin Street. These signs are used to bring awareness to the sharp curve and guide drivers along the curve.

Signal Repairs: Repairs were made to the green indication signal at the intersection of Spring Road and Park Road. Repair is also underway for a pedestrian signal that was damaged during a traffic accident at the intersection of SR 280 and Glendale Place. The pedestrian signal under repair sits at the southeast corner of the intersection.





Audible Push Buttons: In coordination with the Georgia Department of Transportation, six new audible push buttons were installed at the intersection of SR 280 and King Springs Road. The push buttons communicate information about the "walk" and "don't walk" intervals at signalized intersections in non-visual formats to pedestrians who are blind or have low vision. The pedestrian signals can also be operated via an app called PedApp for touchless activation. These push buttons were installed to increase the safety of visually impaired citizens who cross the intersection to access the Vision Rehabilitation Services building off of Mill Pond Road. Another improvement included an increase in the walk clearance time across SR 280.

Batting Cage Updates: The Lattanzi Field batting cages at Ward Park were given some needed attention. YNZ Properties poured a curb barrier to correct the uneven base of the cage. This work is part of a larger project to prepare Lattanzi Field for spring baseball.



WATER DISTRIBUTION

Large Meter Testing and Calibration: Large meter testing for commercial and multifamily units began on January 9. Staff tests meters annually to ensure accuracy. Meters range from 2" to 12" serving large complexes and HOA communities. Contractor Reed and Shows will be performing this work throughout the city, including city buildings. Once testing is performed, calibration and repairs will be made if necessary.

Water Valve Maintenance: Crews are performing valve maintenance in Ward 4 to ensure the valves are located and accessible. This maintenance reduces downtime and provides flushing of the system during water main breaks. While performing maintenance, crews are marking valves in the roadway with reflective markings to help staff locate valves when overnight emergencies arise. Projects will be ongoing through 2023.

Water Main and Service Replacement: Staff is replacing and upgrading outdated water mains and services. Areas are selected after being reviewed for leaks and breaks. Staff is aiming to be proactive instead of reactive to these issues because water mains and services are crucial infrastructures to the community.

- Highlands: Dundee Drive section is complete
- Argo Road: Complete
- Roswell Street: Phase one has begun from Spring Street to Old Roswell Street
- Starline Drive: Approved by Mayor and Council
- Roswell Road: Halfway complete with work expected to be completed in three weeks

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time and determine pipe conditions. Staff is marking the direction of flow around manholes and worked on monthly problem areas this week. These monthly areas will be visited for one week every month until the problem areas can be remediated. The monthly list has decreased from 36 areas to 19. Staff has located many areas with issues that need to be addressed with cured-in-place liner. Repairs will be non-invasive with no excavation needed. Upcoming locations to be rehabbed include Tecumseh Trail, Howell Drive, Dunn Street, and Highland Drive.

Water Damage Repairs: Hard work is continuing on repairing water damages at Brinkley Park and the Wolfe Center from the freezing temperatures in December.

Streets Department: Staff has been hard at work on the following projects:

- Continued work on Pat Mell Road sidewalk project
- Worked on various road repairs at King Street, Roswell Street, Clifton Road, and Shawnee Trail
- Resolved a line of sight issue on King Springs Road at Rhyne Circle
- Removed a tree from the roadway at Ann Road

Adopt-a-Mile: Fourteen Adopt-a-Mile groups (including approximately 120 volunteers!) picked up over 1,110 pounds of litter from Smyrna roadways this past Saturday. Several groups are scheduled to do alternative dates in the coming weeks. The next Adopt-a-Mile cleanup day will be on April 15.


