ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Site Selection Tool: Economic Development has relaunched <u>a site selection tool on the City website.</u> Our state Economic Development partners provide this service for larger properties (office and industrial properties over 20,000 square feet), but small businesses (especially retailers and restaurants) are not represented in that database. City staff previously managed a tedious process of asking brokers to share their information, with staff having to keep the information up to date. Now we have partnered with Select Cobb, as well as Austell and Powder Springs, to share costs for a 3rd party site selection tool for prospects looking for small to mid-sized properties. Listings are compiled of a variety of commercial real estate sites or can be submitted directly by the broker, and only properties in Smyrna are shown on our website. This is an important part of our Economic Development efforts, as it helps us tout investment opportunities in the City and provide our smaller businesses and prospects the ability to search for available space. Kudos to staff member Sherita Martin who identified this solution and pitched it to our partners to make this a cost-effective tool for the City.
