

PARKS AND RECREATION











Parks Maintenance: Despite the heat and rain, Parks Maintenance staff has been working on several projects:

- Expanding the Chuck Camp Park maintenance building
- Installing new sod at the Reed House
- Installing sod and warning track slate at Bartlett Field in preparation for the Little League State Tournament
- Setting up and breaking down tables and chairs for the July concert





Summer Camp: Campers have been busy with fun trips and activities! The week of July 10-14 they visited the Cobb Art Museum, Smyrna Police Department, College Football Hall of Fame, and Fernbank Science Center. The goal was to give campers the opportunity to experience a variety of professions including arts, law enforcement, athletics, and science.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES







Adopt-a-Mile: On Saturday, July 15 Adopt-a-Mile groups cleaned up litter across the city! The results so far show an incredible effort from over 80 volunteers with over 800 pounds of litter cleaned up from Smyrna roadways.





Storm Drain Marking: On Friday morning, four volunteers marked 49 storm drains along Concord Road, McLinden Avenue, Hollis Street, and Eleanor Way. The markers provide education to the public that the drains go directly to the creeks.

Education and Outreach: Last Friday, Julie Barwig visited the Smyrna Optimist Club to speak about the Smyrna Community Garden and other gardens in the city.

Litter Free Event: At the summer concert on July 15, Keep Smyrna Beautiful staff and volunteers passed out trash bags and collected recycling. A total of 282 bags were handed out to attendees to mitigate litter during and after the event. A total of 56 pounds of recyclable materials was gathered at the event.







Recyling Center: As of June 30, the Recyling Center has processed 632,658 pounds of material!

ENGINEERING





SR 280 Resurfacing: The resurfacing of South Cobb Drive and SR 280 is complete. The resurfacing limits were from Austell Road to the Fulton County Subcontractors are currently working to restripe the roadway and replace the traffic loops that were damaged during the resurfacing. The Engineering Department is working closely with the Georgia Department Transportation (GDOT) and subcontractors to ensure all of the traffic loops are replaced accordingly. GDOT anticipates this work to be completed by the end of July. The traffic signal timings will resume to previous schedules once the loops are replaced.

Red Light Cameras: Red light cameras (RLCs) are installed at the intersection of Spring Road and Cumberland Boulevard. The warning live period began on Friday, July 14, and will last for 30 days. Citations may be issued after the warning live period ends. Engineering staff worked closely with the contractor, Verra Mobility, on the placement of the RLCs and warning signs as well as the phasing connections from the traffic signal cabinet to the pull box. Coordination with Cobb County was also required to update the signal timings to meet Georigia Department of Transportation's clearance standards.

Permanent Radar Sign: A permanent dynamic speed radar sign (DSRS) was placed on Old Concord Road near the Logans Walk subdivision. Two additional radar signs are anticipated along Old Concord Road near the Smyrna Grove subdivision and the Westfield Trace subdivision. Traffic data collected on Old Concord Road near Westfield Trace showed significant speeding with 85th percentile speeds between 45-46 MPH. This DSRS is intended to reduce speed in the area.

Pedestrian Improvements: Updates are complete for pedestrian safety improvements at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Windy Hill Road. The updates included two signs that warn right-turning vehicles to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk. These signs were installed at the NE and SW corners of the intersection. Previous improvements include a leading pedestrian interval (LPI) for crosswalks at the northern and southern legs of the intersection. The LPI gives pedestrians a 5-second head start to enter the crosswalk before traffic receives a green signal.



PUBLIC WORKS

Streets Department: The Streets Department has been working on the following projects:

- Continued on Spring Hill Parkway drainage project
- Completed drainage project on Doeskin Lane
- Completed landscaping on Doeskin Court
- Assisted with the July concert set up
- Continued the monthly right-of-way mowing list

Progress in the Council Chambers: The Council Chambers have been painted and the wood laminate is being rehung.





New Fountain: The installation of the fountain in Smyrna Market Village has been completed. After the electrical work is completed, the fountain should be operational by the first of next week.

Soil Cement Stabilization Project: A Public Works contractor has started with the soil cement stabilization project to meet state compliance for erosion runoff issues.
