



R. A. Teasley, Supt. Log Cabin Sunday School Thank You Letter: Cataloguing this past week brought to light a letter with ties to Smyrna area schools, past and present. In 1945, Roy. A. Teasley, Principal of Fitzhugh Lee School, wrote a letter of thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Williams. The Williams had donated \$500 to the Log Cabin Sunday School in honor of Mr. and Mrs. John Vinson Carmicheal who owned a general store in the Oakdale area of Smyrna. This \$500 donation would be equivalent to \$8475 in today's dollars. Fitzhugh Lee School was demolished in 2016 but of course Teasley Elementary named after Roy A. Teasley still exists and welcomed back students this week.

LIBRARY AND MUSEUM

Bethel Cemetery: Museum Manager Jennie Eldredge and Library Director Mary Moore met with Community Development Director Rusty Martin and Keep Smyrna Beautiful Coordinator Eloise Holland on Tuesday, July 25 at the historic Bethel Cemetery in Ward 1. The discussion centered on organizing a volunteer effort to help the Primera Iglesia Bautista de Marietta Church clean up the cemetery. Keep Smyrna Beautiful will provide resources such as buckets, grabbers, gloves, and bags. Jennie Eldredge will organize and direct the volunteers on the day of the cleanup. Mary Moore will use her newsletter to advertise the event and recruit volunteers. Keep Smyrna Beautiful will provide additional volunteer recruitment. Tentatively, the cleanup event will be Saturday, September 30. The grave pictured right is an example of one of the older stones in the historic cemetery.



WATER DISTRIBUTION

Fire Hydrant Project: Crews are currently raising fire hydrants thoughout the city. This is in effort to make them more accessible and easier to operate.

The Highlands Water Main and Service Replacement: The Highlands water main replacement is in progress and is 80% complete.

Glendale Circle Water Main and Service Replacement: Water and Sewer management is currently getting quotes to replace the Glendale Circle water main line. This project will be added City Council meeting agenda on August 7 for approval.



Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Staff is 40% complete with jetting and cleaning and 30% complete with video inspection in Ward 5. Contractors have begun inspecting Ward 3. Ward 2 and Ward 4 are fully completed. All areas in need of repairs will be done with the cured-in-place pipe method.

Valve Maintenance: Staff is performing valve maintenance in Wards 5 and 6.

Water Meter Replacements: Contractor Reed & Shows replaced outdated meters with new digital meters. There were roughly 450 meters converted to 4G for the advanced metering infrastructure project.

Lead Service Inventory: Contractors will be potholing and verifying water service lines as part of the water service line inventory for the Environmental Protection Agency's requirements. Water sample kits are being sent to residents in Ward 3 with qualifying homes built before 1990. Homes in Wards 2 and 4 built before 1986 have been completed. Work in Wards 5 and 6 is scheduled to begin soon.

PUBLIC WORKS

Streets Department: The Streets Department has been working on the following projects:

- Continued the King Springs Road sidewalk installation
- Continued the Spring Hill Parkway drainage project
- Began work on Chuck Camp Park storage building
- Repaired potholes on Sherwood Drive, King Springs Road, and Windy Hill Road
- Continued the monthly right of way mowing list







Council Chambers: Progress is being made in the Council Chambers. The tray for the new lighting is almost complete. Sanding will begin next week.

Market Village Fountain: The new fountain in the Market Village has been completed and is operational.



Soil Cement Stabilization Project: The soil cement stabilization project at the Public Works facility was completed last Friday.

Parks Maintenance: Parks Maintenance crews have been working hard to make sure all of the city's parks are ready for the community to enjoy! Recently they have been working on the following:

- Topdressing the baseball fields at Brinkley Park
- Working with Public Works staff to pour a concrete pad for the new storage building at Chuck Camp Park
- Repaired an irrigation issue at the Reed House event lawn



Tolleson Pool: Tolleson Pool saw the end of this season's weekday swim on July 28. The start of the school year means the pool is now open on weekends only. Come out each Saturday and Sunday from 11:00 AM–6:00 PM and cool off with family and friends through Labor Day on September 4. For those that enjoy the adventure of diving, the diving boards have been repaired and are ready for the fearless jumpers.



Smyrna Handmade Market: The Smyrna Handmade Market hosted nearly 70 vendors Sunday, July 30. Vendors bring a variety of items such as fresh fruits and vegetables, delicious homemade cookies, and treats for your furry family members.
