

## ENGINEERING



**Pedestrian Signal Repair:** Our Traffic Signal Technicians repaired a pedestrian signal that was struck at the intersection of South Cobb Drive and the I-285 N ramp. This repair included rewiring the 7-pair conductor and constructing a new pedestrian assembly.

**Speed Studies:** Speed studies are resuming now that schools have reopened. A dynamic speed radar sign was installed on Mathews Street on August 8 in response to speeding concerns from citizens. All-way stop signs were installed in 2020 at the intersections of Mathews Street and Walker Court, and Mathews Street and Whitfield Street. The traffic data collected from this speed study will also be used to compare data for before and after the all-way stop conditions were implemented.





**Traffic Signal Bulb Repairs:** Our Traffic Signal Technicians replaced traffic signal bulbs that were out at the intersections of Atlanta Road and W. Spring Street, and Atlanta Road and Collier Drive/Montclair Circle.




## **ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES**

**Environmental Education:** School is in session, and so are our School Partnership programs! Smyrna area schools can now apply for Keep Smyrna Beautiful School Grants for up to \$1,000 to support environmental education, school gardens, and beautification projects. Educators can apply for Teacher Continuing Education Scholarships in environmental topics. Schools can request tours of the Smyrna Recycling Center or in-school presentations by Keep Smyrna Beautiful staff on litter, recycling, watersheds, papermaking, and more! **Community Cleanups:** Last Saturday, seven Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up 128 pounds of litter, including 58 pounds of recycling, near Windy Hill Road during a Community Cleanup. On Tuesday, seven more Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up 94 pounds of litter, including 24 pounds of recycling, on East-West Connector.

**Community Garden:** The community garden held a workday with gardeners on August 8 to clear out weeds and maintain the community areas.

## WATER DISTRIBUTION



**Meter Boxes and Service Lines:** Staff has been marking meter boxes to increase accesibility and replacing broken service lines as they are reported.

**Lead Service Inventory:** Contractors will be potholing and verifying water service lines as part of the water service line inventory for the Environmental Protection Agency's requirements. Water sample kits are being sent to residents in Ward 3 with qualifying homes built before 1990. Homes in Wards 2 and 4 built before 1986 have been completed. Work in Wards 5 and 6 is underway.

**Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection:** Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Staff is 40% complete with jetting and cleaning and 30% complete with video inspection in Ward 5. Contractors have begun inspecting Ward 3. Ward 2 and Ward 4 are fully completed. All areas in need of repairs will be done with the cured-in-place pipe method.



**Outfall Lines:** Staff is inspecting and clearing outfall lines around the city. Outfall lines are what connect sewers to subdivisions and streets so sewage can exit to the sewage plant downstream. Pictured above is the before and after of clearing the sewer outfall lines.

**Glendale Circle Water Main and Service Replacement:** The Glendale Circle Water Main and Service Replacement began on August 8. This project will improve outdated water infrastructure in the area. KM Davis will be performing the work.

The Highlands Water Main and Service Replacement: The Highlands water main replacement is in progress and is 80% complete.




