

ENGINEERING

Citation Live for Red Light Cameras: The citation period for the red light cameras at Spring Road and Cumberland Boulevard began on Monday, August 14. Warning signs were placed on some of the major corridors at the city limits and on all approaches of the traffic signal. Red light cameras are also underway at the intersection of South Cobb Drive and East-West Connector/Cumberland Boulevard.

SR 280 Resurfacing Project: The traffic loops and roadway striping is complete for the SR 280 resurfacing project. Engineering staff is working closely with the Georgia Department of Transportation to ensure that all of the traffic loops are active and signal timing is working properly.



PUBLIC WORKS

Streets Department: The Streets Department has been working on the following projects:

- Continuing the King Springs Road sidewalk project
- Continuing the Chuck Camp Park pad installation
- Removing trees from the roadway on Lake Park Drive, Highview Drive, Rita Way, Medlin Street, and Aline Wolfe Road
- Continued the monthly right-of-way mowing list

PUBLIC WORKS

Council Chambers: Progress is continuing to be made in the Council Chambers. After the bench install is completed, the only tasks left are touching up paint and deep cleaning.



WATER DISTRIBUTION



Outfall Lines: Staff is inspecting and clearing outfall lines around the city. Outfall lines are what connect sewers to subdivisions and streets so sewage can exit to the sewage plant downstream.

Glendale Circle Water Main and Service Replacement: The Glendale Circle water main and service replacement is in progress. This project will improve outdated water infrastructure in the area. KM Davis will be performing the work.

The Highlands Water Main and Service Replacement: The Highlands water main replacement is in progress and is 80% complete.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Staff is 40% complete with jetting and cleaning and 30% complete with video inspection in Ward 5. Contractors have begun inspecting Ward 3. Ward 2 and Ward 4 are fully completed. All areas in need of repairs will be done with the cured-in-place pipe method.

Meter Boxes and Service Lines: Staff is marking meter boxes to increase accessibility and replacing broken service lines as they are reported.

Lead Service Inventory: Contractors will be potholing and verifying water service lines as part of the water service line inventory for the Environmental Protection Agency's requirements. Water sample kits are being sent to residents in Ward 3 with qualifying homes built before 1990. Homes in Wards 2 and 4 built before 1986 have been completed. Work in Wards 5 and 6 is underway.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES
