PARKS AND RECREATION

Renovated Outdoor Space: The lawn area that surrounds the Community Center gazebo was renovated in a collaborative effort by various departments. Water Distribution tore out the old, worn, benches and ran a water line from the hydrant to the site. Parks Maintenance staff installed new irrigation and filled the holes in from the benches. Quinn Turf graded and installed the new Zoysia sod, and Russell Landscape spread new pine straw. The work has created a more lush and inviting space for wedding parties to enjoy their important moments with family and friends.

Friends of Smyrna Library: The Friends of Smyrna Library underwrote the purchase of \$1,500 in new Wonderbooks for the Youth Services collection. These special books combine a picture book and audiobook into one product. The user does not need any special equipment to enjoy the book. This new collection has been so popular that the Friends have dedicated another \$1,500 of their proceeds from the August book sale to purchase more Wonderbooks. The August sale was very successful, generating \$2,300 in just two days. The next used book sale will be in October.

Progress at Smyrna Memorial Cemetery: Ashley Shares is finishing up her work at Smyrna Memorial Cemetery. Last Saturday, she used scaffolding and other large equipment to repair some larger monuments. If you see some of her equipment such as clamps to hold the stones together, please leave them alone so the repairs can dry and harden properly.





WATER DISTRIBUTION

Water Meter Change Out: KM Davis is currently changing out the remaining outdated water meters in the city. Water Distribution has roughly 450 meters to convert to 4G as part of the advanced meter infrastructure project.

Valve Maintenance: Staff is conducting valve maintenance in Wards 5 and 6. They have installed pressure meters on fire hydrants throughout the city. These devices will allow staff to monitor water pressure remotely to detect possible water issues.

The Highlands Water Main and Service Replacement: The Highlands water main replacement is in progress and is 80% complete.

Glendale Circle Water Main and Service Replacement: The Glendale Circle water main and service replacement is in progress. This project will improve outdated water infrastructure in the area. KM Davis will be performing the work.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Staff is 40% complete with jetting and cleaning and 30% complete with video inspection in Ward 5. Contractors have begun inspecting Ward 3. Ward 2 and Ward 4 are fully completed. All areas in need of repairs will be done with the cured-in-place pipe method.

Lead Service Inventory: Contractors will be potholing and verifying water service lines as part of the water service line inventory for the Environmental Protection Agency's requirements. Water sample kits are being sent to residents in Ward 3 with qualifying homes built before 1990. Homes in Wards 2 and 4 built before 1986 have been completed. Work in Wards 5 and 6 is underway.

PUBLIC WORKS

Flooding in the City: On the evening of Monday, August 28, the City received approximately 4.2 inches of rain in a period of an hour and a half. The next evening, Tuesday, August 29, an additional 4.75 inches was recorded over three hours. These storm events individually were roughly equivalent to a "100-year storm." Statistically, a 100-year storm event has a 1% chance of occurring in any given year. As a result of these extreme storms on consecutive days, many neighborhoods and streets in the City near creeks and in low-lying areas experienced devastating flooding. Some homes and personal property in these areas sustained significant damage. During and in days after these rain events, the Public Works Department responded to over 120 flooding and drainage-related issues from Smyrna residents. City infrastructure continues to be assessed for damage while debris that had washed into storm drains and pipes is cleared. Public Works staff is working to follow up with all residents affected to address concerns, answer questions, and determine if there are ways the City can implement measures to mitigate future flooding.
