ENGINEERING



RRFB Installations and Repairs: Traffic Signal Technicians Our installed a new Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) pedestrian system for the mid-block crossing at King Springs Road and Dunn Street. This system was installed per the recommendation of the Traffic Calming Committee to improve pedestrian accessibility to Tolleson Park. Separately, an existing RRFB system on Oakdale Road that was damaged during a traffic accident was also repaired by our Traffic Signal Technicians.

Concord Road RPMs: Raised pavement markers (RPMs) were installed on Concord Road along the curve between Love Street and Medlin Street. The RPMs are intended to address a reoccurring issue of vehicles veering off of the road due to speeding along the curve. Other improvements installed this year including a radar sign, curve ahead warning sign, and chevron alignment signs.





Railroad Warning Signs: An LED 'No Left Turn' sign was replaced at the intersection of Atlanta Road and Hawthorne Avenue/Fleming Street for the southbound left turn. This LED sign works in coordination with the railroad preemption at the traffic signal and turns on when a train is approaching. It serves as an additional warning for drivers attempting to turn across the railroad tracks. A similar 'No Left Turn' warning sign needs repair at the intersection of Atlanta Road and W. Spring Street. This repair is underway and will begin once the new sign is received from the vendor.

ENGINEERING

Camera Installations: Our Traffic Signal Technicians worked closely with Smyrna Police Department to install security cameras in preparation for Smyrna's 151st Birthday Celebration. The Engineering Department has also coordinated with the IT Department to troubleshoot various CCTV camera outages at numerous intersections.

Materials Usage Still Rising: For circulation of library materials, all three quarters of 2023 have outperformed the first quarters of 2022. This year is on track to see a 3.5% increase over last year's numbers.

WATER DISTRIBUTION

Weekly Work Orders: Water and Sewer crews resolved 46 work orders last week. This involves regular leaks, resident issues, preventative maintenance, and sewer backups. Crews replaced water service on South Sherwood Road.



Lead Service Inventory: Contractors are potholing and verifying water service lines as part of the water service line inventory for the Environmental Protection Agency's requirements. Homes in Wards 2, 4, and 6 are completed. Crews will move to Ward 7 to finish 39 remaining homes, then to Wards 3 and 5. Qualifying homes will receive test kits for verification.



Water Meter Change Out:

KM Davis is changing out the remaining outdated water meters. The city had 450 meters to convert to 4G as part of the advanced metering infrastructure project. There are roughly 200 meters left to convert.

Glendale Circle Water Main and Service Replacement: The Glendale Circle water main and service replacement is 98% complete. This project will improve outdated water quality in the area. KM Davis is performing the work.

Closed-Circuit Television Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit television (CCTV) equipment. Staff is in Ward 5 using CCTV and cleaning pipes, which is expected to be completed by March 2024. The contractor is finished in the Queensgate subdivision inspecting sewer lines. Ward 2 and Ward 4 are fully completed.


The Highlands Water Main and Service Replacement: The Highlands water main replacement is in the 16th week with the completion of the Prestwick Drive side of the project. The last section of the project is currently underway on Strathmore Road. This project consists of roughly one mile of water main replacement along with 81 service connections and is 98% completed.
