



Pedestrian Signal Repairs: Our Traffic Signal Technicians repaired a pedestrian signal that was hit during a traffic accident at South Cobb Drive and the I-285 Southbound ramp, pictured left. Luckily only the base needed to be replaced and the other parts of the system were salvageable. Repairs were also made to the push button on the pedestrian signal at southwest corner of Spring Road and Jonquil Drive.

Red-Light Running Photo Enforcement System (RLRPES): Warning traffic signs were installed at the intersection of South Cobb Drive and East-West Connector/Cumberland Parkway in conjunction with the RLRPES project, pictured right. The signs warn that the traffic signal at this intersection is photo-enforced. The contractor anticipates finishing the camera tie-ins to the


