ENGINEERING





New No Parking Zone: A new no parking zone was established along River View Road and Nichols Drive for vehicles over 5 tons. The no parking zone stretches along both sides of River View Road from Purple Coneflower Avenue to Nichols Drive, and along both sides of Nichols Drive from River View Road to Armstrong Place. The signs were implemented due to concerns of large trucks occupying the parallel spaces that are meant for guest parking for adjacent residential properties and businesses.

WATER DISTRIBUTION



Work Orders: Staff resolved several work orders last week including:

- Water Main Breaks: 0
- Sewer Backups: 2
- Water service leaks: 3
- Customer Issues: 4

Water and Sewer staff take great pride in being responsible for the installation, repairs, and maintenance of 150 miles of sewer pipes, and 250 miles of water main pipes. We are currently providing services to 15,237 customers in the City of Smyrna. We guarantee above and beyond service, and safe clean water supply to each customer every day.

Water Main and Service Replacement Projects: Water mains and services are being replaced in several locations around the city.

Highlands Drive: 90% CompleteGlendale Circle: CompleteBurbank Circle: 90% Complete

Water Service Inventory Verification: Water service inventory verification is underway. Homes in Wards 2, 4, and 6 are completed. Work in Ward 3 will begin this month.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Inspections in Wards 1, 2, 4, and 5 are completed. Inspections in Ward 6 are underway by Smyrna staff, and inspections in Ward 3 are underway by a contractor.

Upgraded Equipment: The Water and Sewer Division purchased an upgraded sewer lateral camera system through the CIP budget. Staff can now identify issues in the system without having to dig into the ground. This new equipment will allow staff to better serve Smyrna residents.

Celebrating Native American Heritage Month: Smyrna Library took full advantage of the new library patio and greenspace on Monday, October 30 when hosting Jim Sawgrass who discussed the history and culture of the Muscogee Creek people. Mr. Sawgrass spread out scores of artifacts and demonstrated the use of his spears and arrows.



Local Heroes in Focus: Last week was especially busy with several adult programs. On Monday, October 30, Dr. William Marchione and Museum Manager Jennie Eldredge profiled eight local women of Smyrna's past in a lecture entitled "Notable Women of Smyrna: Part 1." The lecture was covered in the Marietta Daily Journal November 4 and 5 weekend edition. Part 2 will feature eight more women in March 2024.

On Sunday, November 5, the library screened "The Lieutenant and the Cobb County Boys," a documentary featuring oral interviews of Cobb County World War II veterans. The oral histories were collected over 20 years ago by Pat Burns, a local historian, and she was to answer questions after the film. A companion photography exhibit about these veterans is on exhibit in the upstairs gallery and display cases through December 30. The photos are part of Smyrna Museum's permanent collection, and Jennie Eldredge installed the exhibit on October 31.
