PUBLIC WORKS

Streets Department: The Streets Department has been hard at work on the following projects:

- Roadway repairs on Pinehurst Drive, Hillside Road, Napa Valley Court, and Turpin Road
- Repaired broken catch basin tops on Devin Court, Powder Springs Street, and Starline Drive
- Trimmed the right of way on Highlands Parkway, Oak Drive, Oakdale Road, King Springs Road, and McCauley Road

Community Center Visitor: Over the holidays, a hawk flew into the Community Center through an open door while work was being done. Because hawks are federally protected, a trapping company will not touch them. Public Works and Parks and Recreation staff worked together to figure out a logistical way to remove the bird. Raymond Ferguson (Ferg) and Shannon Werner removed the bird safely after it spent roughly five days inside of the building.

Throughout the event, 20 volunteers unloaded trees from 285 cars and distributed redbud seedlings and seed packets.





WATER DISTRIBUTION



Work Orders: Staff resolved several work orders last week including:

- Water Main Breaks: 1
- Sewer Backups: 5
- Water Service Leaks: 7
- Customer Issues: 40

Water and Sewer staff take great pride in being responsible for the installation, repairs, and maintenance of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes. We are currently providing services to 15,237 customers in the City of Smyrna. We guarantee above and beyond service and safe, clean water supply to each customer every day.

Water Service Inventory Verification: Water service inventory verification is underway. Homes in Wards 2, 4 and 6 are completed.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Inspections in Wards 1, 2, 4, and 5 are completed. Inspections in Ward 6 are underway by Smyrna staff, and inspections in Ward 3 are underway by a contractor.

Water Main and Service Replacement Projects: Water mains and services are being replaced in several locations around the city.

- Highlands Drive & Burbank Circle: Completed with landscaping in progress
- Glendale Circle & Springwood Drive: Completed

Water Meter Change-Outs: Water crews have been working on the remaining 100 residential meter change-outs to make our system 4G and up to date. The work is about 95% complete.
