

ENGINEERING



MS4 Permit Reapplication: The City of Smyrna has an MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) permit issued by the Georgia Environmental Protection Division. An MS4 permit is issued to municipalities and establishes the responsibilities and actions required to manage stormwater runoff and protect water quality. The permit includes provisions for monitoring, infrastructure inspections, reporting, public outreach, pollution prevention, and compliance with regulations such as the Clean Water Act. This permit requires annual reporting reapplication every five years. The Engineering Department is preparing for the city's reapplication later this year.

Railroad Crossing Signs Installed: Our Traffic Engineering staff installed Federal Railroad Administration signage to assist in continually improving motorist safety at and near railroad crossings. The installation, repair, and replacement of these warning signs play an important part in reducing the risk of preventable accidents.



WATER DISTRIBUTION

Water and Sewer staff take great pride in being responsible for the installation, repairs, and maintenance of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes. We are currently providing services to 15,237 customers in the City of Smyrna. We guarantee above and beyond service and safe, clean water supply to each customer every day.



Work Orders: Staff resolved several work orders last week including:

- Water Main Breaks: 4
- Sewer Backups: 3
- Water Service Leaks: 2
- Resolved Work Tickets: 22

Water Service Inventory Verification: Water service inventory verification is underway. Homes in Wards 2, 4 and 6 are completed. Work in Ward 3 is underway.

Closed-Circuit TV Pipe Inspection: Sewer infrastructure is being graded with closed-circuit TV equipment. This technology allows staff to view lines in real time, determine pipe conditions, and make corrections when necessary. Inspections in Wards 1, 2, 4, and 5 are completed. Inspections in Ward 6 are underway by Smyrna staff and are 50% complete, and inspections in Ward 3 are currently on hold.

Water Main and Service Replacement Projects: Water mains and services are being replaced in several locations around the city. The chart below reflects the schedule for the replacement projects. Currently, work is underway in the following locations:

- South Cobb Drive
- Creatwood Subdivision
