Water and Sewer staff take great pride in being responsible for the installation, repairs, and maintenance of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes. We are currently providing services to 15,237 customers in the City of Smyrna. We guarantee above and beyond service and safe, clean water supply to each customer every day.

Sewer and Camera Inspection: This technology enables staff to monitor pipelines in real time, assess pipe conditions, and implement corrections as needed.

South Cobb Drive Water Main Replacement: KM Davis Contracting has initiated the replacement of the water main along South Cobb Drive. They have installed 2500 feet of 12-inch pipe and are currently identifying all utilities between King Springs Road and the Emory doctor's office. Upon project completion, they will replace a 20-inch asbestos cement (A/C) water main, currently at a depth of over 25 feet, with a 12-inch ductile iron water main at a depth of 5 feet. The depth of these water mains is critical for maintenance and repair purposes.


Creatwood Water Line Replacement: Ardito Construction is actively engaged in a water line replacement endeavor within the Creatwood subdivision. They are in the process of installing services on Mohawk Place and conducting boring activities on driveways along Creatwood Trail. This project encompasses the replacement of 10,000 linear feet of water main and service lines, forming a crucial part of the project. Please refer to the schedule below for further details.

WATER DISTRIBUTION

Customer Tip: We've all heard it before: that slight knocking sound coming from the pipes in your house or the inlet pipe as the water rushes through, traveling to its next destination. The knocking could be a hydraulic surge otherwise known as a water hammer. So, what exactly is a water hammer? It is a rapid change of pressure in a pipe system that can have devastating consequences.

So now you may be asking yourself, what causes the hydraulic surging? There are a couple of causes, one being the rapid starting or stopping of the water main. Another cause of hydraulic surging is the rapid opening or closing of fire hydrants throughout the system. Therefore, it is always recommended that valves or hydrants be opened or closed slowly. An illustrated example is pictured right. Lastly, a hydraulic surge can be caused by malfunctioning equipment or by general human error.

Tours of the Smyrna Recycling Center: Since last Monday, we've had two more tours of the Smyrna Recycling Center. The Kiwanis Club of Smyrna toured the center on Tuesday and our final class from Smyrna First United Methodist Church Preschool visited on Thursday. The preschoolers also participated in a paper recycling activity. In April alone, 160 people toured the center to learn how to recycle better! Recycling Center: This past week, the Smyrna Recycling Center shipped out 28,900 pounds of glass, 15,574 pounds of cardboard, 7,338 pounds of mixed paper, 2,640 pounds of cooking oil, 1,684 pounds of fluorescent bulbs, 950 pounds of paint, 670 pounds of #1 plastic, 634 pounds of #2 plastic, 372 pounds of hard-to-recycle plastics, and 300 pounds of clothing donations to the Kidney Fund.

Jonquil Festival: At last weekend's Jonquil Festival, KSB volunteers collected 16 bags of recyclable material totaling 110 pounds at the event. 
THE SMYRNA GARDEN TOUR IS THIS SATURDAY!

New Temporary Exhibit: This week, Jennie Eldredge is preparing for the installation of the new temporary exhibit: *A Mind Without Rhythm: Brawner Hospital and Mental Health in Smyrna*. Exhibit mounts must be made of conservation-quality material so they can safely hold the exhibit artifacts. We use undyed, unbleached, cotton fabric to create backing for pins and other jewelry items, hand-cut acrylic covers for paper artifacts, and brass wire to create mountings to hold objects in place. The new exhibit will debut on Saturday, May 18 from 2:00-4:00 PM.


