

Community Cleanups: This week, we had two Community Cleanups: one on South Cobb Drive on Friday and one on Riverview Road on Monday. Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers picked up a total of 208 pounds of litter, including 84 pounds of recyclable material that was taken back to the Smyrna Recycling Center. Picking up litter protects local wildlife and the health of our waterways. It also makes Smyrna a more beautiful place to live!

Recycling Center: This past week, the Smyrna Recycling Center shipped out 14,660 pounds of mixed metal, 14,596 pounds of cardboard, 6,982 pounds of mixed paper, 1,900 pounds of motor oil, 1,478 pounds of plastic #1 (PET), 1,086 pounds of office paper, 266 pounds of hard-to-recycle plastics, and 200 pounds of clothes donations to the Kidney Fund.

Monthly Recycling Center Tour: The monthly tour of the recycling center took place last Friday. One adult and four children toured the center and took part in a paper recycling activity. The Smyrna Recycling Center offers free monthly tours from 9:00-10:00 AM on the third Friday of every month. The next tour is coming up Friday, June 21. Sign up for an upcoming tour here!

Sewer and Camera Inspection: This technology enables staff to monitor pipelines in real time, assess pipe conditions, and implement corrections as needed.

- Wards 2, 4, 5, 6, and 7 are completed
- Staff is beginning inspections in Ward 1
- Ward 3 is being completed by a contractor

Water and Sewer staff take immense pride in the installation, repair, and upkeep of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes throughout the city. Currently serving 15,237 customers, our staff is committed to delivering exceptional service that goes above and beyond, ensuring a safe and clean water supply to every customer.

Water Service Inventory Verification: This project is almost complete as staff wraps up the last of the inventory.

South Cobb Drive Water Main Replacement: KM Davis Contracting has initiated the replacement of the water main along South Cobb Drive. They have installed 2500 feet of 12-inch pipe and are currently identifying all utilities between King Springs Road and the Emory doctor's office. Upon project completion, they will replace a 20-inch asbestos cement (A/C) water main, currently at a depth of over 25 feet, with a 12-inch ductile iron water main at a depth of 5 feet. The depth of these water mains is critical for maintenance and repair purposes.

Creatwood Water Line Replacement: Ardito Construction is actively engaged in a water line replacement endeavor within the Creatwood subdivision. They are in the process of installing services on Mohawk Place and conducting boring activities on driveways along Creatwood Trail. This project encompasses the replacement of 10,000 linear feet of water main and service lines, forming a crucial part of the project. Please see the project schedule below for further details
