Bench Ceremony in Concord Covered Bridge Historic District: On Tuesday, June 18, Library Director Mary Moore, Museum Manager Jennie Eldredge, Museum Intern Fiona Rainwater. Councilmember Susan Wilkinson. and Councilmember Rickey Oglesby all attended the dedication ceremony for the new "Bench by the Road" located at the Silver Comet Trailhead in the Concord Covered Bridge Historic District. The commemorative bench and plaque honor the formerly enslaved African Americans of Cobb County and their contributions to our area. Researcher Pat Burns discussed the history of the project as well as Matilda Ruff and her family who had worked at Ruff's Mill and continued to live in the area after emancipation. Susan Wilkinson pulled double-duty at the ceremony as she was also representing the Jonquil Garden Club which helped with Matilda's Garden.





Cemetery Volunteer Opportunity: Come beautify your community by helping to clean up historic Daniell Cemetery (3761 Cloudland Drive) in the Bennett Woods neighborhood on Saturday, June 29 from 9:00 AM-12:00 PM. Community Cleanup: On Tuesday, six KSB volunteers picked up 67 pounds of litter, including 14 pounds of recycling, during a Community Cleanup on Pat Mell Road. This is material that won't end up in our waterways, harming wildlife and polluting water sources.



Monthly Recycling Center Tour: Three adults and three children joined our monthly tour of the Smyrna Recycling Center last Friday. Participants got to look behind the scenes at how the center operates, learn about recycling best practices, and participate in a paper recycling activity. Monthly tours are free and open to the public, but registration is required. They take place on the third Friday of the month from 9:00-10:00 AM. Register for a tour.

WATER DISTRIBUTION



Work Orders

Sewer and Camera Inspection: This technology enables staff to monitor pipelines in real time, assess pipe conditions, and implement corrections as needed.

- Wards 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and 7 are completed
- Ward 3 is being completed by a contractor

Water and Sewer staff take immense pride in the installation, repair, and upkeep of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes throughout the city. Currently serving 15,237 customers, our staff is committed to delivering exceptional service that goes above and beyond, ensuring a safe and clean water supply to every customer.

Water Service Inventory Verification: This project is almost complete as staff wraps up the last of the inventory.

South Cobb Drive Water Main Replacement: KM Davis Contracting has initiated the replacement of the water main along South Cobb Drive. They have installed 2500 feet of 12-inch pipe and are currently identifying all utilities between King Springs Road and the Emory doctor's office. Upon project completion, they will replace a 20-inch asbestos cement (A/C) water main, currently at a depth of over 25 feet, with a 12-inch ductile iron water main at a depth of 5 feet. The depth of these water mains is critical for maintenance and repair purposes.

Creatwood Water Line Replacement: Ardito Construction is actively engaged in a water line replacement endeavor within the Creatwood subdivision. They are in the process of installing services on Mohawk Place and conducting boring activities on driveways along Creatwood Trail. This project encompasses the replacement of 10,000 linear feet of water main and service lines, forming a crucial part of the project. Please see the project schedule below for further details
