

Summer is Busy: We are halfway through summer and our readers have already logged over 120,000 minutes of reading! June circulation of materials was the highest month of usage in library history, with a 15% increase over June 2023 circulation. June 2024 saw a 38% increase in walk-in traffic over June 2023. FY2024 circulation of materials finished very strong with an 8.61% increase over FY2023.

Cemetery Cleanup: On Saturday, June 29, five volunteers took part in a cemetery cleaning workshop at Daniell Cemetery. This was the first clean-up in this cemetery that sits in the middle of Bennett Woods. A few of our volunteers live in Bennett Woods and were very helpful and enthusiastic about keeping their neighborhood cemetery clean.

The next cemetery clean-up workshop will be held on Saturday, July 20, from 9:00 AM-12:00 PM at Smyrna Memorial Cemetery.







Daniell Cemetery History: The stone for Naomi Daniell marks the first burial in Daniell Cemetery. Naomi died of smallpox and nervous residents did not want her husband Robert Daniell to transport her body to the traditional family burial ground at Maloney Springs Cemetery. Therefore, he buried her on his property and started Daniell Cemetery in 1862.

WATER DISTRIBUTION




Water and Sewer staff take immense pride in the installation, repair, and upkeep of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes throughout the city. Currently serving 15,237 customers, our staff is committed to delivering exceptional service that goes above and beyond, ensuring a safe and clean water supply to every customer.

Work Orders

Atlanta Gas Light Cross Bore Project: Atlanta Gas Light is starting a CCTV project in Wards 2 and 3. The project will begin in Ward 2 on a small section and then move on to Ward 3. They will be video-inspecting the sewer mains and laterals to ensure no gas lines are going through our sewer system.

Crossed gas and sewer lines become a concern if a plumber or resident tries to fix a clogged pipe using a mechanical rotary device and puncture the gas pipeline.



Water Service Inventory Verification: This project is almost complete as staff wraps up the last of the inventory.

Current Projects: There are various water main and line replacements happening around the city.

- KM Davis Contracting has initiated the replacement of the water main along South Cobb Drive. They have installed 300 feet of 12-inch pipe and are currently identifying all utilities between King Springs Road and the Emory doctor's office. Upon project completion, they will replace a 20-inch asbestos cement (A/C) water main, currently at a depth of over 25 feet, with a 12-inch ductile iron water main at a depth of 5 feet. The depth of these water mains is critical for maintenance and repair purposes.
- Ardito Construction is actively engaged in a water line replacement endeavor within the Creatwood subdivision. They are in the process of installing services on Mohawk Place and conducting boring activities on driveways along Creatwood Trail. This project encompasses the replacement of 10,000 linear feet of water main and service lines, forming a crucial part of the project.
- Smith Pipeline is currently replacing the water main and services on Carolyn Drive, Rolling View Drive, Brenda Drive, and Spring Drive. This water main replacement project is part of Water Distribution's 30-year replacement plan.
