WATER DISTRIBUTION




Water and Sewer staff take immense pride in the installation, repair, and upkeep of 150 miles of sewer pipes and 250 miles of water main pipes throughout the city. Currently serving 15,237 customers, our staff is committed to delivering exceptional service that goes above and beyond, ensuring a safe and clean water supply to every customer.

Atlanta Gas Light Cross Bore Project: Atlanta Gas Light is starting a CCTV project in Wards 2 and 3. The project will begin in Ward 2 on a small section and then move on to Ward 3. They will be video-inspecting the sewer mains and laterals to ensure no gas lines are going through our sewer system.

Crossed gas and sewer lines become a concern if a plumber or resident tries to fix a clogged pipe using a mechanical rotary device and puncture the gas pipeline.



Water Service Inventory Verification: This project is almost complete as staff wraps up the last of the inventory.

Current Projects: There are various water main and line replacements happening around the city.

- KM Davis Contracting has initiated the replacement of the water main along South Cobb Drive. They have installed 300 feet of 12-inch pipe and are currently identifying all utilities between King Springs Road and the Emory doctor's office. Upon project completion, they will replace a 20-inch asbestos cement (A/C) water main, currently at a depth of over 25 feet, with a 12-inch ductile iron water main at a depth of 5 feet. The depth of these water mains is critical for maintenance and repair purposes.
- Ardito Construction is actively engaged in a water line replacement endeavor within the Creatwood subdivision. They are in the process of installing services on Mohawk Place and conducting boring activities on driveways along Creatwood Trail. This project encompasses the replacement of 10,000 linear feet of water main and service lines, forming a crucial part of the project.
- Smith Pipeline is currently replacing the water main and services on Carolyn Drive, Rolling View Drive, Brenda Drive, and Spring Drive. This water main replacement project is part of Water Distribution's 30-year replacement plan.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES







Litter-Free Summer Concert: Keep Smyrna Beautiful volunteers made sure last weekend's summer concert was litter-free by handing out litter bags and collecting recycling. In all, they handed out 221 trash bags to concertgoers and collected 90 pounds of recycling. That's almost twice as much material diverted from the landfill as what was diverted last month! KSB also handed out educational (and cooling!) hand fans to remind residents to recycle.





Community Cleanup: On Saturday, KSB volunteers picked up 75 pounds of litter, including 15 pounds of recycling, during a Community Cleanup around Chuck Camp Park and Benson Poole Road. This is material that won't end up in our waterways harming wildlife and polluting water sources.

Monthly Recycling Center Tour: The monthly tour of the Smyrna Recycling Center will take place this Friday. Participants will look behind the scenes at how the center operates, learn about recycling best practices, and participate in a paper recycling activity. Monthly tours are free and open to the public, but registration is required. They take place on the third Friday of the month from 9:00-10:00 AM. Register for a tour.




