Back-to-School Recycling Tip: To kick off the back-toschool season, Keep Smyrna Beautiful will be sharing some school-focused recycling tips and reminders. Today we're talking about lunches and plastic. School lunches have many recyclable plastic components from plastic #1 water bottles to plastic films and wrappers, which can be placed in orange Hefty ReNew bags. Plastic #1 and Hefty ReNew bags can be dropped off at the <u>Smyrna Recycling Center</u>. WATER DISTRIBUTION

The City of Smyrna Water/Sewer and Utilities office is committed to its fundamental objective:

- To provide our citizens with a water supply and system of the highest quality, which includes wastewater collection
- Protect the system by meeting or exceeding all regulatory requirements in an environmentally sound manner
- Ensure the city's needs are met

Water Line Replacement Projects: Various water line replacements are happening around the city. Contractors complete these projects as part of the ongoing thirty-year water line replacement program. Staff members select lines based on criteria such as age, size, and pipe material. Current projects include:

- Creatwood Trail: The final punch list is being completed on this project
- Spring Drive: Final landscaping is being completed on this project
- South Cobb Drive: Final landscaping is being completed on this project
- King Springs Road: This project is now complete



Atlanta Gas Light Cross Bore Project: Atlanta Gas Light is inspecting sewer lines in Wards 2 and 3. The purpose of this project is to inspect sewer mains and laterals to ensure no gas lines are going through our sewer system. So far, four cross bores have been found and repaired.

Crossed gas and sewer lines become a concern if a plumber or resident tries to fix a clogged pipe using a mechanical rotary device and puncture the gas pipeline.

Meter Knowledge: Do you understand your allegro water meter? Current flow, flow/leak indicator, alarms, and gallons billed can be found on your water meter. See the image on the right for further details.
