

WATER DISTRIBUTION



Community Outreach: Director Bo Jones and Assistant Director Steven Watts attended a town hall meeting with Smyrna citizens and Ward 6 Councilmember Tim Gould. During the meeting management discussed water line replacement projects and provided guidance on how to read and understand water meters. Our department would like to extend thanks to Tim Gould and the entire City Council, and City administration for their continued support of staff and residents.

WATER DISTRIBUTION



Water Line Replacement Projects: Various water line replacements are happening around the city. Contractors complete these projects as part of the ongoing thirty-year water line replacement program. Staff members select lines based on criteria such as age, size, and pipe material. Current projects include:

- Creatwood Trail, Spring Drive, South Cobb Drive, King Springs Road: These projects are now completed
- Lake Court Drive: Landscaping is now being completed on this project
- Westbooke Drive: This project is in progress
- Debra Drive, Vaneta Way, Colby Court, Lee Street: These projects are being scheduled

The City of Smyrna Water/Sewer and Utilities office is committed to its fundamental objective:

- To provide our citizens with a water supply and system of the highest quality, which includes wastewater collection
- Protect the system by meeting or exceeding all regulatory requirements in an environmentally sound manner
- Ensure the city's needs are met

Water and Sewer Operations Division Training: Water and Sewer Operations crews consist of a field foreman, an equipment operator, and two crew workers. They are responsible for handling emergency calls, day-to-day issues, and after-hours on-call situations related to water and sewer distribution. Pictured in the blue shirt in the above photos is Operator Brandon Martinez, who has four years of service with the City of Smyrna. Brandon is currently training new staff on how to repair a water service under pressure; a common task the crews face daily. Mastering this skill allows them to fix water services without shutting off the main supply to the street or neighborhood.


