Water Line Replacement Projects: Various water line replacements are happening around the city. Contractors complete these projects as part of the ongoing thirty-year water line replacement program. Staff members select lines based on criteria such as age, size, and pipe material. Current projects include:

- Lake Court Drive: Landscaping is now being completed
- Westbooke Drive: In progress
- Debra Drive, Vaneta Way, Colby Court, Lee Street: Being scheduled
