

Adopt-a-Mile: On Saturday, KSB Adopt-a-Mile volunteers cleaned the streets of Smyrna for the final quarterly Adopt-a-Mile cleanup of the year. We're still gathering all the data from the day, but so far just over 100 volunteers spent 150+ hours picking up 1,000+ pounds of litter on Saturday!





Monthly Recycling Center Tour: Last Friday, three patrons toured the Smyrna Recycling Center during our monthly tour. Tour participants get a behind-the-scenes look at the center and learn how to recycle better and what materials go on to become in their next life. Bulky Trash Amnesty Day: On Saturday, KSB partnered with Smyrna Public Works to serve 471 cars during Bulky Trash Amnesty Day for Smyrna residents. The purpose of this event is to provide a needed service for residents and to discourage and prevent illegal dumping.







Teasley Elementary Career Day: On Friday, KSB Coordinator Eloise Holland visited a classroom of first graders at Teasley Elementary to talk about litter, recycling, and how they can make the world a better place. KSB visits classrooms of all ages throughout Smyrna to talk about KSB's work, recycling, environmental education, and more!

PUBLIC WORKS

Street Department: The Street Department has been working on the following tasks:

- Assisted with the Smyrna Birthday Celebration set up and break down
- Installed a concrete slab at the Public Works facility for a storage structure
- Repaired drainage issues on Concord Road, North Thomas Lane, Hickory Mill Drive, Powder Springs Street, Mill Pond Road, and Gilbert Street (pictured right)
- Repaired potholes on Spring Road, Village Parkway, Highlands Parkway, McCoba Drive, Prestwick Place, and the Smyrna Museum parking lot
- Continued work on monthly right of way mowing schedule





WATER DISTRIBUTION

The City of Smyrna Water/Sewer and Utilities office is committed to its fundamental objective:

- To provide our citizens with a water supply and system of the highest quality, which includes wastewater collection
- Protect the system by meeting or exceeding all regulatory requirements in an environmentally sound manner
- Ensure the city's needs are met

Water Line Replacement Projects: Various water line replacements are happening around the city. Contractors complete these projects as part of the ongoing thirty-year water line replacement program. Staff members select lines based on criteria such as age, size, and pipe material. Current projects include:

- Creatwood Trail, Spring Drive, South Cobb Drive, King Springs Road: Completed
- Lake Court Drive: Landscaping is now being completed
- Westbook Drive: In progress
- Debra Drive, Vaneta Way, Colby Court, Lee Street: Being scheduled






Water Leak Repairs: Staff has been working on a water leak that has surfaced on Spring Road. We are currently in the process of having a leak detection company, with the assistance of Cobb County Water System, determine where the leak is coming from. When the leak is located, repairs will be made to rectify the issue.

Sewer Manhole Installation: Staff has been working to install a new sewer manhole and 700 feet of sewer main at River Line Park for a future development. This process is being completed in house to ensure that the sewer system is up to date.



WATER DISTRIBUTION



Lead-Free Water System: Water Distribution has completed inventorying the material for public and customer-owned service lines in our distribution system including residential and non-residential customers and has determined that our system is lead-free.
