

School Recycling Tours and Activities: Over three days last week, 92 students and teachers toured the Smyrna Recycling Center. Sixth graders and teachers from two Amana Academy groups participated in a chemical water monitoring activity, while a large homeschool group with students of all ages and their parents participated in a papermaking activity to learn how paper is recycled.



Crafts and Drafts Festival: Volunteers and board members hosted 321 visitors to KSB's Crafts and Drafts booth to play our environmental game, purchase jonquil bulbs, and learn about how KSB helps keep Smyrna clean, green, and beautiful. We also collected seven large bags of recycling and diverted 68 pounds of material from the landfill.

The last of the jonquil bulbs were sold at Crafts and Drafts! We were thrilled at the response this year and look forward to seeing all the jonquils bloom in the spring.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

Rivers Alive: In partnership with Cobb Water and the National Park Service, this Saturday, KSB is hosting the annual Rivers Alive cleanup to pick up trash along the Chattahoochee. We expect about 50 volunteers. A renovation at our usual location has moved this event temporarily to the Powers Island Unit, which accommodates fewer volunteers.



WATER DISTRIBUTION

The City of Smyrna Water/Sewer and Utilities office is committed to its fundamental objective:

- To provide our citizens with a water supply and system of the highest quality, which includes wastewater collection
- Protect the system by meeting or exceeding all regulatory requirements in an environmentally sound manner
- Ensure the city's needs are met

Water Line Replacement Projects: Various water line replacements are happening around the city. Contractors complete these projects as part of the ongoing thirty-year water line replacement program. Staff members select lines based on criteria such as age, size, and pipe material. Current projects include:

- Creatwood Trail, Spring Drive, South Cobb Drive, King Springs Road: Completed
- Lake Court Drive: Landscaping is now being completed
- Westbook Drive and Lee Street: In progress
- Debra Drive, Vaneta Way, Colby Court: Being scheduled



Water Leak Repairs: Staff worked with leak detection companies and Cobb County Water System to locate a leak on Spring Road. The leak was located and necessary repairs were made.

Sewer Manhole Installation: Staff is installing a new sewer manhole and 700 feet of sewer main at River Line Park for a future development. This process is being completed in house to ensure that the sewer system is up to date.
